RU Syndicate postpones 'controversial' appointments

Teachers demand cancellation of process

The Raishahi University Syndicate at its meeting Sunday night postponed the proposed appointments of three teachers in the Islamic History and Culture (IHC) department and also of 159 employees in the university

The Daily Star on Sunday published a report on the 'controversial' appointment process

The RU authorities recently selected three candidates for their appointment as teachers in the department, allegedly ignoring objection by the departments' planning committee members.

Five out of seven members of the planning committee objected to the proposed appointments, saying the department does not need any more

They met the RU VC on August 8 and demanded cancellation of the recruitment process. They also submitted a memorandum to the VC earlier protesting the proposed

When contacted over phone, Chairman of Islamic History and Culture department Prof ABM Shahajan declined to make any comment about the postponement.

A high official at the university seeking anonymity said that the 'appointments have been postponed because some national dailies published news against the appointment processes'.

When contacted university register Prof Abdus Salam said that Islamic History and Culture department appointment process are not

On the other hand, 178 RU teachers in a statement yesterday expressed deep concern over the IHC department's appointment process, ignoring objection by the departments' planning committee

They said that the proposed appointment of teachers would violate the University Act of 1973 that bars the Vice-chancellor to 'overrule' the decision of planning committee members

They also said that recruitment of three teachers is unnecessary as the department is over staffed and some of the teachers do not get the chance to take even one class in a

They also protested the agitation and misbehabiour by 544 employees on Sunday at the administration building demanding confirmation of their appointments. They RU teachers demanded punishment to the They also called urged the RU

authorities to cancel the appointment process in the Islamic History and Culture department. On Sunday, the 544 third and fourth class employees laid a siege

to the Vice-chancellors office and

kept him confined to his room for several hours. They were protesting the proposed appointment of more 159 employees while their services were yet to be confirmed.

Monday's Syndicate meeting was also scheduled to okay appointment of 159 people, most of whom are alleged to be relatives and wards of ruling party men in One of the three teacher candi-

Bridges not built in 10 yrs

Durgapur delinked from Netrakona dist town

Durgapur, a tourist spot in is virtually isolated from rest of the country as construction of two bridges started long ago is yet to be completed and two others damaged by last year's flood are awaiting

It is a surprise to local people why construction of the two bridges can not be completed in so many years. There is no move to repair the damaged bridges

A frontier upazila near the Garo hills, Durgapur is inhabitated mostly by indigenous people. It has deposits of china clay, coal and other

The biggest china clay mine in the country is in Bijoypur in Durgapur upazila. A ceramic industry based on the clay has been set up in Durgapur.

At least 40 tonnes of coal are collected every day from Sumeshowary river and supplied to other

It is also known for the Birishiri Tribal Cultural Academy, the lone centre for tribal cultural activities in

Durgapur supplies fruits like banana, pineapple but traders from other districts have to make a tedious journey and face so many hurdles to reach the producers.

Durgapur upazila headquarters is only 45 km from Netrakona district town. Construction of Suknakuri and Someshwary bridges was started in 1995 and 1998 respectively by the Roads and Highway Department (R&H) at estimated costs of Tk 7.50 crore and Tk 9 crore. But they are yet to be com-

About 40 per cent work of both the bridges were completed. Netrakona R&H officials said.

There is no initiative to repair the damaged Gujalikanda bridge in Purbadhala upazila and Janzail bridge in Durgapur upazila.

Talking to this correspondent. M Karim Abbasi, lawmaker from Durgapur-Kalmakanda constituency, said Durgapur has great

9 die of diarrhoea, pneumonia in Gaibandha

At least 9 people died of diarrhoea and pneumonia in the district in last 3 days, according to sources in Gaibandha Civil Surgeon's (CS)

Of them, 6 persons died of diarrhoea and three others of pneumo-

They said 249 people have been attacked with diarrhoea and 35 with pneumonia. But unofficial sources put the figures at 337 and 65.

Those killed by diarrhoea are Masuma Begum, 29, Abdul Hakim, 7 months, both of Palashbari, Shilpi Rani, 12, Tahmina Begum, 25,

Marjina Begum, 35, of Sunderganj and Tumpa Begum, 8, of Gaibandha Sadar. Pneumonia victims are Azizul Islam, 11 months, Monowara Begum, 70, and Kanti Bhusan. 45. the official sources said.

With recession of floodwaters. water-borne diseases have broken out alarmingly in remote shoal areas of Palashbari, Sunderganj Sadullapur, Shaghata, Fulchari and Gaibandha Sadar upazilas.

The sources said medical teams have been sent to the affected areas where drinking water is scarce. Medicines and saline packets are in short supply, they said

In another incident yesterday, a minor airl died under the wheels of bus in Kadupur on the same highway. Critically injured Smriti Rani Debnath, 10, was declared dead when taken to Moulvibazar Sadar Hospital. The killer bus sped away.
