6 killed in separate road accidents

Six people, including a woman, were killed in separate road accidents in last two days.

Of them, four were killed in the city and two at Dhamrai near Dhaka.

A Dhaka-bound jeep dashed Rahim Uddin, 40, and Anisur Rahman Anis, 30, at about 5:00am when they were waiting to download sand from a truck at Dhulivita bus stand in Dhamrai

The injured Rahim Uddin was rushed to Dhamrai Health Complex where the doctors declared him dead. A passenger bus hit Sabbir Ahmed

when he was crossing a road in front of Anik Plaza, Section-12 of Mirpur at about 8:00am leaving him seriously injured. He was rushed to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) where the doctors declared him dead.

A truck ran over a three-wheeler van driver Md Ranga Mia, 35, near Bashundhara Gate at Badda at 4:30am. He died while being rushed to
