England's Ashes triumph adds the spice

England's overthrow of Australia in the Ashes has generated huge interest among cricket sponsors and fans in their tour of Pakistan starting next month, the cricket board chief said here Tuesday.

The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) had already acquired sponsorship of 150 million rupees (2.5 million dollars) -- the second highest in Pakistan history after last year's series against India, board chairman Shaharyar Khan said.

"There is a definite link to the Ashes. The PCB used to pursue the sponsors but now they are coming to us which shows the market value of the game has increased," Khan

"By dethroning Australia as Ashes champions, England have built up a reputation and cricket lovers now feel that there would be a good contest in the Pakistan-

England series," he said. England, who last week took back the Ashes after a gap of 18 years, are due to tour Pakistan from late October, playing three Tests and five one-day matches.

Their announcement Monday of a 17-man Test squad that includes all the 12 players who featured in the Ashes series, and a strong 15-man one-day squad have added to Pakistan's anticipation, Khan said.

"Everyone who has played the Ashes is coming, which adds more spice to the series," he said.

Pakistan had also been warned to expect a bigger-than-usual contingent of English fans -- the Barmy SEE PAGE 13 COL 1

New CCL goes outside Dhaka next month

The domestic cricket season will start next month with the third edition of the Corporate Cricket League (CCL) which for the first time will be staged across the country.

According to the calendar approved by the newly elected Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) executive committee, the curtainraiser tournament was scheduled to begin on October 1 but it is likely to be deferred by a couple of days following requests from the participating teams.

In the absence of league commit-tee chairman Shah Nurul Kabir Shahin, who is now in Sri Lanka, BCB general secretary Mahbubul Anam along with two officials met with the team representatives on Monday.

"We have decided to defer the league following requests from the

teams and now it is likely to start on each group then qualifying for the October 5," said Ali Hossain, the member-secretary of the league

Following protests from the corporate houses the BCB has decided to revert to a one-day format instead of Twenty20 competition. But the most significant feature of the CCL this time is matches being played at three different venues across the country.

Chittagong, Khulna and Bogra besides Fatullah Cricket Stadium, Dhanmondi Cricket Stadium and BKSP will be used as venues.

"The participating teams have agreed to play outside Dhaka at their own expense which will help to complete the league by October," Ali said adding that they have also decided to allow bank teams in the competition.

Another change in the format sees a total of twelve teams split into two groups who will play on league basis with the two top finishers from

semifinals. Previously there was a two-tier competition (Cup and Plate

groups).

Eleven teams including four newcomers have already confirmed. their participation. Interested houses can enroll by September 23 with the entry fee of Tk 25,000. New entrants Security Air

Express, Pan Pacific Sonargaon Hotel, Metro Real Estate Group and Jamuna Bank will join Araf Apparels, Gazi Tank, Acme, Ispahani, Biman, Beximco and Epylion. However defending champions

GrameenPhone, CityCell, Aktel, Partex Group and Robin Textile were reluctant to take part because they had little to prepare their teams.

But GrameenPhone will sponsor the league for the third time and it was informed that the leading cellular operator has agreed to increase its sponsorship.

Bashar's worst night

Bangladesh captain Habibul Bashar's fears that they would not be able to bank on early advantages came true after the opening day of the second and final Test against Sri Lanka on Tuesday.

After the Tigers enjoyed a fruitful morning session where had the Sri Lanka reeling at 48-4 it was however one-way traffic after centuries by Tillakaratne Dilshan (168) and Thilan Samaraweera (138) paved the way for hosts to reach a commanding 449-7. They contributed with a record 280 runs for the fifth wicket.

"We had a very good start. There was something for the pacers in the wicket early. The wicket became much easier but giving five runs per over is not acceptable," said a frustrated Bashar.

"After the first hour, we were really getting prepared to bat in the

"They had their last pair batting so I continued bowling Syed Rasel for ten overs. One pacer could bowl hardly seven overs in this kind of heat but I was taking a chance to get rid of one of them. I never thought they would go so far.

"We just needed one wicket before the tail opened. But it was really frustrating to take the second new ball because the spinners could not get a stranglehold over their batsmen. If the spinners could do something, we would have been on top. Even Mohammad Rafique's experience did not work. The two batted tremendously well and counter attacked us. We also needed to take the chances that came to Aftab Ahmed and Enamul Haque. We really bowled badly in the end and could not stop the flow of runs. I would have been happy if they had 350 on board at close but scor-

ing nearly 450 runs in a day means we have to play to survive only. "Our target will be to save the

match from now on," he added.

On the other hand, Tillakaratne Dilshan established himself as a crisis man for Sri Lanka.

The fluent stroke-maker, who top-scored with 86 in the first Test, put the hosts in the driving seat. SEE PAGE 13 COL 1

Syed Rasel moved the ball either way and Atapattu became the first victim of the seaming conditions when he edged a Shahadat outswinger to wicketkeeper Khaled Mashud after the Bangladesh speedster troubled the Lankan captain with a nagging line on his off-stump.

The day was very special for charismatic opener Sanath Jayasuriya, who became the first ever Sri Lankan to appear in 100 Test matches. To mark the day Sri Lanka's World Cup winning captain Arjuna Ranatunga, now a minister, was to hand over a bat to the explosive batsman.

Jayasuriya released 100 balloons with school students, who throughout proceedings kept the ground alive with exuberant cheers, giving him a guard of honour and the 36year-old cut a cake with 100th Test written on it to end the centenary match programme. He also received a commemorative watch from a businessman.

The party, however, turned dour for the southpaw who was trapped lbw on 13 by Tigers left-arm pacer Rasel as the home side lost two

He added that the tournament would take place every year with the participation of three popular teams each from India and Bangladesh.

India and Bangladesh will be the hosts of the tournament every alternate year.

In India, the tournament will be named as the Ganga-Padma and in Bangladesh it will be the Padma-Ganga football tournament.

Chappell blames media

India went into Tuesday's second Test against Zimbabwe in Harare with coach Greg Chappell playing down differences with captain Sourav Ganguly and blaming the media for fanning the controversy.

Chappell, appointed India's

coach in June, was at the centre of a storm for asking Ganguly to step down as captain before last week's first Test in Bulawayo because of his poor batting form. Ganguly, India's most successful Test captain, responded by carving

out a painstaking six-hour century against the weakest attack in cricket and then revealed the dressingroom discussion with the coach to the media. Chappell issued a hand-written statement ahead of the second Test, saying his efforts to motivate

a call for the batsman to stand down "It is disappointing that what was a private discussion between the captain and myself has become a cause of public speculation," the former Australian skipper said.

Ganguly had been misinterpreted as

"Even more disappointing is that much of what has been written does not represent the discussion fairly. "It was a frank discussion about

Indian cricket, present and future, The Express has been reliably and much of what I said was aimed at motivating Sourav for the Bulawayo Test.

Brazilian midfielder Ronaldinho was elected the first FIFPro world player of the year on Monday from a poll of 38,000 professional players in 40 countries.

"There are no greater football critics than the players themselves," insisted FIFPro president Gordon Taylor after the Barcelona star topped the voting.

Ronaldinho was named FIFA Player of the Year last December, but Taylor added: "To be recognized by your fellow professionals from across the world is a unique honor." Barca's Ronaldinho agreed saying: "It's a great honour to receive

another one of these big prizes and this one is extra special because it's voted for by my fellow players." The members of the players' world association also voted in a secret ballot to choose the 2004-05

season's best team from a shortlist of 55 top names. "While we respect the many other football awards that are handed out I think it is special to see these results, the very first ballot among the world's

players," said Taylor Featuring alongside 2002 World Cup winner Ronaldinho in the allstar team's midfield were Real Madrid's Zinedine Zidane with French compatriot Claude Makelele and his Chelsea team mate Frank

Lampard of England.

AC Milan, last season's Champions League runners-up, provided five players.

Goalkeeper Dida and defender Cafu -- also both of Brazil -- as well as Italian defenders Paolo Maldini and

long succession of low scores. The main beneficiary was Irfan Pathan, whose seven wickets for

only 59 runs proved to be comfortably his Test career best. Zimbabwe had no a persistent accuracy and swinging pace. Pathan has taken 16 Zimba

we wickets in the two Tests so far.

The home side were put into bat by Sourav Ganguly after he won the toss, which proved to be the correct Zimbabwe lost their first four wickets for only 30 runs. Their big-gest loss was that of Tatenda Taibu, who was out second ball for a duck,

But equally damaging to the home cause were the early depar-tures of Brendan Taylor for four, Terry Duffin for 12 and Dion Ebrahim (to Zaheer Khan) for 14. Only two reasonable partner-

ships saved Zimbabwe from utter collapse. Heath Streak and Hamilton Mazakadsa put on 44 for the fifth wicket and Andy Blignaut with Charles Coventry made 43 for the seventh.

Although Anil Kumble was below par, drawing a blank, Harbhajan Singh once again proved the most successful of the spinners with two wickets, those of Streak and Coventry, who was top scorer with 37. At the lunch break Zimbabwe
