

# Jamaat link

militant organisation Jama'at ul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) have confessed that the JMB carried out the August 17 attacks.

Jamaat chief always ruled out JMB existence. The most wanted militant Bangla Bhai is a creation of media, he has said several times. Even yesterday Nizami told parliament that "A section of media is also engaged in the evil design to implicate Jamaat in the incident (August 17 blasts) by hook or crook."

Jamaat lawmaker Riasat Ali Biswas in the last parliament session also denied the existence of JMB in Bangladesh.

Analysts say the reason behind Jamaat-militant link can be answered with an observation that finds a deep-rooted aspiration to secure more state power.

Jamaat is aiming to get tickets for 100 seats of the coalition in the next parliamentary elections and it wants to have other Islamist parties with it to make the plan a success, said an analyst.

According to the analyst, Jamaat's quite-evident role in the bomb blasts is a powerful demonstration of its military prowess and also a warning to the BNP that it will have to face trouble if it wants to break alliances with them.

Jamaat is also sending signal to other Islamist parties and militant groups that they will face trouble if they do not join hands with it," the analyst said, pointing to a recent speech of the prime minister in which she asked other Islamist parties to join the coalition.

**MILITANTS' JAMAAT LINK**  
Bangla Bhai, head of the killing squad of the banned Jagrata Muslim Janata Bangladesh (JMJB), had been an active Shibir member until 1995.

JMB chief Abdur Rahman and his father were also Jamaat workers. Many in the JMB leadership joined the organisation on special assignments from Jamaat and Shibir.

Moreover, statements of the arrestees prove that Jamaat is involved with the JMB one way or the other.

Nasiruddin, whom police arrested in Sakhira on August 17 and who first confessed that the JMB carried out the countrywide bomb attacks, told the police that he was a Jamaat worker until 1995.

On September 1, police arrested Tariqul Islam in Faridpur with Shibir certificate and he confessed to police that he was involved with the organisation as a student leader.

After his arrest at Debiganj in Panchagarh on February 23 last year, militant Azizul told police he was previously a Shibir member and now a worker of the JMB.

JMB militants Samiul Al Siju and Fazlul Haq admitted after their arrest at Gangachharia in Rangpur on February 23 that they were active Shibir workers.

However, the then assistant superintendent of police in Rangpur in his probe report on the attack on BPC office identified the two as Rokans of Rangpur.

In August 2003, Sohel, a student of Sumangaj Government College, was arrested for having links with the JMB. His brother Selim told the press on August 23, "Shibir turned my brother into an ultra-religious man and forced him to work for JMB."

Local Shibir President Abu Hanif, however, denied the link saying, "Sohel might have worked for us previously but is no more a Shibir worker now."

Last November, three militants were arrested with 24 powerful gelatine bomb-sticks and 124 electronic detonators in Gaibandha from a Shantahar-bound train. All of them said they are Shibir activists although Jamaat disowned them.

Ahle Hadith Andolon Bangladesh (Ahab) chief Asadullah Al Galib, who is now in jail custody for bombing an NGO office, organised a press conference in Rajshahi town on February 17. A Jamaat lawmaker from Sakhira attended the event.

**LOBBY AND RELEASE**  
Police on the night of September 14 arrested two Shibir activists with CDs and books allegedly on Islamic jihad at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban premises. Jamaat lawmakers lobbied with the speaker for their release following the incident.

The next day Teigoan police produced the two before a court without bringing any specific charges against them and the two were released.

Speaker Jamiruddin Sircar admitted that lawmaker Abdul Aziz made a phone call to him requesting him to initiate steps to release the two Shibir men.

Three days after the August 17 blasts, Rapid Action Battalion arrested five militants, including Jamaat leader Abdul Majid, in Dinajpur and handed them over to the police. Majid was freed within 30 minutes following intervention of the local Jamaat unit.

Police arrested five militants, including one Ramijuddin in Dinajpur on August 22. The district Jamaat unit bailed out Ramij from the police station.

**JAMAAT & SHIBIR BOMBBLAST SUSPECTS**  
Police arrested Jamaat activists Kaffiuddin, Kazi Nazrul Islam and madrasa teacher Jarjis in Chandpur and Omar Faruk at Parbatpur on August 19.

Abdul Haq, former Jamaat unit chief of Gabtoli, Bogra, Abul Hossain and Mujibur Rahman were arrested in Khulna a day later. Police arrested Shibir activist Hefaluddin at a mosque in Bianbazar on September 9.

Police in Kushtia arrested Shibir activist Mustassim Billah on August 22 for links with the August 17 blasts.

Police arrested 13 suspected militants, including Enamul-a-follower of Bangla Bhai, and two Rajshahi University (RU) students, at their

Babul's relatives denied the allegation and told reporters that Rokeya's clothes caught fire accidentally when she was cooking.

Babul could not be found. Rokeya's uncle Motiur Rahman filed an unnatural death case with Lalbagh Police Station.

Meanwhile, an angry mob caught six alleged robbers in front of a house near Jurain rail-gate area in Shyampur when they were preparing for a robbery around 1:00pm yesterday and handed them over to police after beating them up severely, police said.

The alleged robbers are Mamun, 23, Sohel, 20, Zakir, 22, Swapan Sikder, 23, Zafar Ali, 20, and Dulal Miah, 22. They were later admitted to the DMCH for treatment under police custody.

In another incident, Akhtar Hossain, 22, the mason, was returning home after finishing his work at a nearby house in Banani at around 1:30pm when three youths stopped him on his way.

"They came by a car and tried to snatch away my cell phone," Akhtar said. "As I resisted they shot me in the leg and took away my phone," he added. Akhtar is undergoing treatment at DMCH.

In a separate incident, police recovered an unidentified newly born girl from the sunshade of a house at 52/1 RK Mission Road in Sutrapur.

Azhar Ali, owner of the building, informed the police seeing the baby on the sunshade of the second floor of the building. Police went to the spot at 10:30am and called in the Fire Service and Civil Defence who rescued the child.

The baby girl was admitted to DMCH. Police suspected that someone might have wanted to kill the girl but the baby luckily caught the sunshade.

Governor Dr Salehuddin Ahmed was selected as the chairman of the Saarc Finance meet.

The contribution of each country to the fund will be determined on the basis of a certain country's foreign currency reserve, its import and export volume, balance of payment position and size of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Allocation from the fund for each country will be determined on the basis of its per capita income, poverty rate and other related indicators.

According to the source, the relatively rich countries of the Saarc are not very enthusiastic about the fund. As per the draft modality of the fund, they will have to contribute more to the fund but will receive less from it.

Besides, a difference of opinion between India and Pakistan has surfaced regarding the size of the fund. While Pakistan wants the initial fund size to be over \$1 billion, India seeks an initial amount of around \$500 million on the grounds that it is still in the beginning stage and the fund size can be increased after observing the results.

The BB source said Bangladesh is trying to push the issue forward as once the fund is created, international donor agencies like World Bank and Asian Development Bank may contribute to it. However, the donor agencies will have to be convinced about the use of the fund before they put in their contribution, the source added.

If the heads of the Saarc countries give go-ahead to the fund, further details regarding the modality and size of the fund will be worked out and will be presented to the next Saarc Finance Governors' symposium on "Micro Finance and Poverty Alleviation" due next January in Dhaka.

Ramadan Awami League will exchange views with representatives of different groups and will launch mass contact campaigns all over the country.

Referring to the November 15 grand rally in Dhaka, Jalil said "striking programmes" including hartal, blockade and gherao will be announced from the rally.

He said Awami League President and Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Sheikh Hasina would announce this programmes from the grand rally to bring an end to misrule in the country.

Jalil said the minimum programme of the 14-party alliance will be announced for the month of Ramadan.

Emphasising the need for a greater unity of other opposition parties, he said the 14-party alliance has taken a shape and now is trying to unite the pro-liberation forces to launch a grand programme for the emancipation of the people from the clutches of misrule of this BNP-Jamaat alliance government.

The Awami League leader also hinted that his party is taking preparation for the next general election and said that they will spell out their national programmes on health, education and eradication of corruption and combating terrorism.

Referring to a press report of appointments of 150 election officials allegedly belonging to the ruling BNP's student wing, the Awami League general secretary said "The appointments will be cancelled if our reform formula is endorsed."

He reiterated that there will be no election without reform.

# Hurricane Rita roars

The federal government was eager to show it, too, had learned its lesson after being criticized for its sluggish response to Katrina. It rushed hundreds of truckloads of water, ice and ready-made meals to the Gulf Coast and put rescue and medical teams on standby.

"You can't play around with this storm," Homeland Security Secretary Michael Chertoff said on ABC's "Good Morning America." He added: "The lesson is that when the storm hits, the best place to be is to be out of the path of the storm."

By early afternoon, Rita was a Category 4 storm centered more than 700 miles southeast of Corpus Christi, with winds of 150 mph. Forecasters predicted it would come ashore Saturday along the central Texas coast between Galveston and Corpus Christi. But even a slight rightward turn could prove devastating to New Orleans.

Meteorologist Chris Landsea of the National Hurricane Center in Miami said Rita could strengthen into a terrifying Category 5 with wind over 155 mph as it moves over the warm waters of the gulf.

Galveston County, population 267,000, was ordered evacuated, along with low-lying, flood-prone areas of Houston, which at its lowest point is 6 feet above sea level. Altogether, as many as 1 million people in the Houston-Galveston area were under orders to get out, said Frank Michel, spokesman for Houston Mayor Bill White. Houston is about 50 miles northwest of Galveston.

Along the Louisiana coast, some 20,000 people or more were being evacuated or were warned to leave.

Galveston, situated on an island 8 feet above sea level, was the site of one of the deadliest natural disasters in U.S. history: an unnamed hurricane in 1900 that killed between 6,000 and 12,000 people and practically wiped the city off the map.

The last major hurricane to hit Texas was Alicia in 1983. It flooded downtown Houston, spawned 22 tornadoes and left 21 people dead. The damage from the Category 3 storm was put at more than \$2 billion. Tropical Storm Allison flooded Houston in 2001, doing major damage to hospitals and research centers and killing 23 people.

operated during hartal hours. Police charged baton on a procession of Workers Party at city's Paltan crossing and picked up seven activists early in the morning.

At least 26 Awami Jubo Mahila League leaders and workers received injuries when police charged baton to disperse their procession in Dhanmondi Road No 5 area.

Jubo Mahila League activists also attacked police to snatch away their arrested colleagues.

The daily Samakal photojournalist Kajo received severe injuries in his head while the Jubo Mahila League activists hurled stones aiming at the police. Police picked up six activists from there.

Police intercepted a procession of Awami Mahila League when it reached Mirpur-10 intersection at 10:30am.

Ten activists including local commissioner Shahida Aktar Dikti were severely injured when police clubbed the procession to disperse the AL activists.

Channel-I reporter Mahbub Matin was also injured in the police attack. Police later picked up several people including some female activists from the spot.

Police also charged baton to disperse another procession of Mahila League in the Green Road area when it tried to proceed towards Russell Square, leaving at least eight women injured. Police picked up four Mahila League activists including its General Secretary Fazilatun Nessa Indra.

A group of AL leaders including some lawmakers brought out a procession and staged sit-in demonstration near Dhanmondi Road No-32 during hartal hours.

Police intercepted a procession of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) when it tried to go out through the main entrance of the Arts Faculty of Dhaka University.

Police also dispersed another pro-hartal procession led by AL leader Hajj Selim in the old part of the city. Several activists were wounded in police action while four activists were picked up from the spot.

**ALLAWMAKERINTURED**  
Our Staff Correspondent reports from Khulna: AL lawmaker Panchanon Biswas and five other people were injured in a clash between the activists of AL and BNP at Batiaghata of the district during yesterday's hartal.

The clash ensued when BNP activists attacked an AL procession led by Biswas at around 11:15am near Batiaghata bazaar, witnesses said.

The five other injured are Kamrul Islam Shipar, Shumon Molla, Nazrul Islam and Alok Mallick of BNP and AL leader Mithun Roy.

AL blamed BNP for the attack on the procession while BNP accused AL of creating lawlessness in the name of picketing during hartal.

However, the hartal passed off peacefully in Khulna city and in other parts of the district.

The CEC told reporters that everyone has the right to have a political ideology. The facts that they have got the appointments by virtue of their merit. If anyone shows his political bias in his work, steps will be taken against him, he added.

The EC is a constitutional body, he noted. The officials whose appointments raised questions have also been appointed through the PSC, which too is a constitutional body.

The CEC mentioned that the process of the appointments in question started through a circular in newspapers on September 17, 2003. A total of 40,558 candidates took part in the written examination, of whom 3,212 were selected for viva and finally 328 were selected for appointment.

Among them, 297 have already joined service while 27 had problems in passing the medical test and three others did not join as they are already in government service.

"Political loyalty is not our main concern", the CEC said. Everyone has his or her own political belief as they are entitled to cast vote. If one is meritorious, one should get a job. It is immaterial whether one was a JCD leader or not. One's past is not important and what counts is if one is working well or not, he said.

The CEC assured that the EC would ensure neutrality in the elections and there is no scope of politicisation after one joins it.

Caught at slip on 36 off a no-ball, Nafees was dismissed in the penultimate ball of the day with the shadows deepening after the umpires refused the batsmen's appeal to stop play for inadequate light.

Steve Bucknor and Billy Bowden, however, called stumps just one delivery after Nafees had edged Muttiah Muralitharan to the lone slip. It ended a 75-run stand between Nafees and Ashrafu, the visitors' second best in the series after skipper Habubul Bashar and Ashrafu's 92 in the first innings of the first Test.

Bangladesh began their second essay shortly after tea and opener Javed Omar ended a poor series when he mistimed a pull to short midwicket fielder Marvan Atapattu.

A controversial decision prolonged Bangladesh's miseries as Bashar was adjudged caught by Muralitharan at gully although bowler Dilhara Fernando had clearly over-stepped. Nafees Iqbal, desperate to get some runs after returning to open the innings, was caught behind off his gloves down the leg. He clubbed four boundaries to notch 30 off 35 balls.

That wicket also went to Fernando, the wrecker in chief in the first innings with 5-60 from his 11-over spell.

Earlier, Sri Lanka declared their first innings adding seven runs to their overnight total of 449-7. Fast bowler Shahadat (4-108) clean bowled Muralitharan while Syed Raseel (4-129) dismissed Chaminda Vaas in similar way as the innings lasted just 2.3 overs in the morning.

Investigators, however, declined to disclose the names of the experts. Sources said the investigators maintained silence as there may be some in-service defence men besides the retired ones.

Meanwhile, Abdur Rahman Masud, who was arrested at Kaliakair in Gazipur in the early hours yesterday, told the police that they held a secret meeting at Moirartek in the capital's Uttara the night before the August 17 countrywide bomb attacks.

Besides confessing that he himself blasted a bomb at Khilgaon, Masud told detectives that he along with several other militants took army training at a mosque in Narsingdi early this year.

He named JMB chief Abdur Rahman's brother Ataur Rahman Sunny, Solaiman and Hassan among others as his trainers.

Masud, son of madrasa teacher Moulana Akhteruddin of Fulbari in Kaliakair, and his associate Nurul Islam, son of one Iman Ali of Barua in Tangail, provided detectives with significant information during interrogation, sources said.

"In 2002, Gazipur JMB Ehsar [district chief] Jubair gave me dawta [invitation] to join JMB and I accepted it," Masud told reporters at the Detective Branch (DB) office in Dhaka.

Two or three days before August 17, one Reza of Gazipur told him that the call of Islam needs to reach more people and Masud should work for it soon.

"One Zahid took me to an Ahle Hadith mosque at Moirartek the night before August 17," said Masud, a second year Alim (HSC) student of Tamrul Millat Madrasa at Gazipur.

At a meeting that night, Zahid gave Masud and seven others a packet of bombs and instructed to activate them at 11:00am.

"I switched on a bomb and abandoned it in front of Khilkhet Rajuk Trade Centre six minutes before schedule," Masud told reporters.

He left for Gazipur the same day. He said there were separate teams for planting bombs, distributing leaflets and monitoring these two teams.

A former supporter of ruling Jamaat-e-Islami's student front Islami Chhatra Shibir, Masud said he used to contribute monthly donation to Shibir regularly.

**KISHOREGANJ**  
Our Kishoreganj correspondent reports: Superintendent of Police (SP) Mollick Fakhrul Islam said Harunur disclosed significant information during primary interrogations.

Sources said Harunur also confessed to his involvement with the JMB and gave training to the JMB bomb squads in Kishoreganj, Tangail, Jamalpur and Dhaka.

A court also placed Sumon on a seven-day fresh remand. Kishoreganj police started for Dhaka to join interrogation of Harunur and Sumon at the Joint Interrogation Cell (JIC).

**HARUNUR'S BACKGROUND**  
Son of Abdur Rashid Mia of East Kutubpur in Bajitpur, Kishoreganj, Harunur joined the 4th East Bengal as a sepoy in 1982, said DB sources.

He was promoted as lance nayek at 46th East Bengal in 1990 and joined 51st East Bengal two years later. He retired from army in 1998.

Harunur set up a shoe store at 51 Duriangur Lane in Kishoreganj four months ago. He has another store at Nababpur in Dhaka.

On learning about Suman's arrest, Harunur left Kishoreganj and started staying at his father-in-law's house in Monipur area of Mirpur in Dhaka with his second wife Rozy.

Harunur is yet to divorce his first wife Ruby while his third wife Neela has already divorced him.

He was accused in a robbery case in 2003 in Bajitpur and was awarded imprisonment. He also killed a pedestrian while riding a motorbike.

**180 fishermen**

towards the Indian coast.

Thousands of relatives of the missing fishermen gathered at the Patharghata riverside apart from other coastal belts and are looking for their near and dear ones.

In Barguna, 30 fishing trawlers with 390 fishermen aboard, who went missing during the turbulent tidal surge, returned Patharghata. But they could not confirm the fate of 700 other fishermen.

The fishermen told journalists that they have seen at least 50 trawlers and bodies of many fishermen floating on the seawaters.

On Tuesday night, trawler FB Jotsna, which was one of the six missing trawlers of Gulishkhali village, returned with 15 fishermen on board. Eight trawlers of Noli area did not return as yet.

One of the fortunate fishermen, Altaf Hossain, told the news agency that he witnessed sinking of more than 40 trawlers during the turbulent weather. He returned by another trawler along with 14 other fishermen.

Owner of FB Al Salam of Laxmipur Mohinuddin, who returned to Patharghata, said he along with 14 other fishermen, including Babul, Chandu, Musa, Yunus, Afzal, Mohan, Jahangir, Selim, Hazrat Ali and Tyeb Ali went to an island near the Indian territory.

"I have seen some 25-30 trawlers over there," he said.

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
