# British troops reduce presence in Basra

### Iraqi city refuses to work with UK soldiers

British troops in the tense southern city of Basra greatly reduced their presence in the streets yesterday, apparently responding to a call from the provincial governor to sever cooperation until London apologised for storming a police station to

For the second day, no British forces were seen with accompanying Iraqi police on patrols of Basra, as they routinely had in the past.

Elsewhere, a roadside bomb hit a US convoy in southern Baghdad, killing one soldier and wounding six others Wednesday. Suspected insurgents gunned down at least eight

In an interview with Associated Press Television News in Baghdad Thursday, Iraqi National Security Adviser Mowaffak al-Rubaie called Monday's attack by British forces on a police station in Basra "a flagrant violation of Iraqi sovereignty."

At least five Iraqis were killed during a day of clashes between British forces and Iraqi police and demonstrators on Monday. British armour crashed into a jail to free the two soldiers who had been arrested by Iraqi police and militiamen, Earlier, a crowd attacked British troops with stones and Molotov cocktails.

The fighting has raised concern

over the increasing boldness of Shia militias in the south of the country and the challenge they pose to the 8,500-strong British force in the region. As recently as Wedne-sday, Britain vowed to keep its troops in the country until they no longer are needed, but also has leaked information recently about planning for a troop reduction. The Shia militias complicate the British role no mat-

Earlier the Iraqi city of Basra said yesterday it would not cooperate with Britain until it received an apology and compensation after a British raid to free two soldiers.

'The governing council met yesterday and decided to stop all cooperation with the British until they meet three demands," Basra governor Mohammed al-Waili told

"To apologise for what hap-pened, to guarantee that it does not happen again, and third, to provide some compensation for all the damage they did during the opera-tion," he said.

#### Mexican anti-drug minister dies in chopper crash

A cabinet minister who helped lead Mexico's anti-drug fight, his deputy and seven others died in a helicopter crash in the mountains west of Mexico's capital on Wednesday. There were no survivors.

While one official aboard the craft had received death threats from a drug trafficker, authorities said the crash appeared to be an accident caused by poor visibility due to dense cloud cover.

The helicopter, carrying Public Safety Secretary Ramon Martin Huerta, Federal Preventive Police Chief Tomas Valencia, five other passengers and a crew of two, had taken off from a military parade ground in Mexico City.

#### Top Kyrgyz revolution leader killed

A top Kyrgyz lawmaker and key figure in this former Soviet state's popular revolution in March, Bayaman Erkinbayev, was shot dead outside his house late Wednesday in the Kyrgyz capital Bishkek, police officials said yesterday.

When the deputy came out of his car in front of his house he was shot at from behind some bushes. He died from his injuries in intensive care at the national hospital," Interior Minister Murat Sutalinov told an emergency session of



Pradesh was yesterday rushing experts to assess the devastation caused by powerful storms, which battered thousands of villages and towns on the coast of the Bay of Bengal, officials said. While fresh rains drenched two adjoining states, the flood situation

was easing in Andhra Pradesh where at least 58 people died and 150,000 others lost their homes or have been displaced since Tuesday, they said. The worst seems to be over as the levels of Godavari and Krishna

rivers are receding and now there is no fresh threat of floods," Andhra Pradesh disaster management commissioner Shashank Goel told AFP in the state capital Hyderabad. "If all goes well we'll start sending

some of these displaced persons back home," Goel said of the tens of thousands of residents evacuated to 473 emergency camps in 10 of the state's 23 districts shattered by storms and rains. The rains stopped Thursday in Andhra Pradesh but other officials

said a heavy downpour in the swollen Godavari river's upper catch-ment areas in adjoining Maharastra state was causing concern. "This is an issue of worry," an official from the state's agriculture ministry

said as Karnataka, another province shouldering Andhra Pradesh, reported non-stop rains in its Bidar district for the third straight day Thursday.

Commissioner Goel said officials and engineers were being sent to the

coastal region where 3,672 villages and towns were lashed by the storm, locally nicknamed "Pyaar (Myanmarese for "flattened").

The ... repair work will begin only after the water recedes," Goel said as normality gradually returned to the flooded Andhra cities of Vijaywada and Rajamundri.

The storm destroyed 275,000 acres (111,288 hectares) of farmland, breached 600 irrigation canals, swept away hundreds of bridges and roads and snapped electricity supplies across wide swathes of the state.

More than 9,700 houses were completely destroyed by the powerful winds that barrelled across the cotton- and rice-growing province off the Bay of Bengal

Andhra Pradesh agriculture minister Raghuveera Reddy overnight said the rains accompanying the storms caused damage to the tune of 180 billion rupees (420 million dollars) to crops, state facilities and homes.

Reddy, in a memorandum to Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, who visited Andhra Pradesh Wednesday, sought federal assis-tance of 120 billion rupees.

"Apart from the financial assis-

tance we have also sought 1.2 million tonnes of rice and the prime minister's response was quite positive," state chief minister Rajasekhara Reddy separately told reporters

In nearby Orissa, the administration overnight evacuated 12,000 people from low-lying areas in 10 of the state's 30 districts.

# Storm-battered Andhra Indo-Pak Kashmiri leaders seek end to violence

Among the other key Kashmiri leaders who took part in the deliber-ations were Bhim Singh, the Panthers Party leader, former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister Farooq Abdullah, and Abdul Ghani Bhat and Sajjad Lone of the Hurriyat

# Ratify nuke treaty

Secretary General Kofi Annan urged the United States and 10 other key countries to ratify the nuclear testban treaty so it can finally take effect, but like Pakistan, India, Israel and North Korea, the US administration refuses to do so.

Opening a conference Wednesday to spur the treaty's entry into force, Annan said all countries should be gravely concerned that nine years after the treaty was opened for signatures, it still hasn't entered into force.

## Troops mount raid in Pak tribal area

Ten suspects detained

Pakistani troops backed by helicopters arrested 10 suspected militants yesterday during a search in a tribal zone near the Afghan border, officials said.

The crackdown in the rugged region of North Waziristan came a week after the military said it had busted the biggest al-Qaeda base in

"We have arrested 10 suspects and also seized seven passports," a military official said as several hundred soldiers surrounded three villages in the area. He did not give the detainees' nationalities.

Around 600 rounds of antiaircraft ammunition were also recovered in the raids, the official said, requesting anonymity.

Earlier, soldiers in about 100 vehicles had cordoned off Tatta Khel, 35km west of the region's main town Miranshah, to hunt for militants after a series of rocket attacks, a local official told AFP.

One soldier was injured when the convoy came under fire from unknown gunmen, the official said, requesting anonymity.

Searches were also made in the nearby villages of Mizer and Hamzoi. Some ammunition and documents were uncovered but no arrests were made there.

Last week Pakistan said it had raided the largest al-Qaeda hideout in North Waziristan, arrested 35 people and recovered a huge hoard of weapons from a religious school compound owned by a Taliban sympathiser.

#### China rejects US call for democracy

China yesterday rejected a US call to adopt democracy, telling Washington to respect its communist path and brushing off warnings of retaliation for its huge trade surplus with the United States.

Foreign Ministry spokesman Qin Gang told reporters he had "taken note" of comments by US Deputy Secretary of State Robert Zoellick that China's oneparty system was unsustainable, but insisted the country was stable and that communism had brought substantial benefits to its 1.3 billion people.

Zoellick on Wednesday made the Bush administration's most explicit call to date for a political transition in China, where the Communist Party will mark the anniversary of its 56th year in power on Oct. 1.

"Closed politics cannot be a permanent feature of Chinese society," Zoellick told a meeting of the National Committee on US-China Relations in NewYork. "It is simply not sustainable."
