Khulna 'mastermind' of Aug 17 blasts held

5 more arrested in countrywide raids

Law enforcers yesterday discovered a den of banned Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) operatives at Batiaghata in Khulna and claimed that the place had been used to make the bombs that were blasted in Khulna city on August 17.

Police arrested Gazi Abdul Hakim, 48, landlord of the house, suspecting him to be one of the

masterminds behind the serial blasts and a top JMB leader. During the raid, they also seized from his bedroom 16 empty cartons believed to have been used to store bombs.

Besides, some powder explosives, pieces of wire, jagged fragments of marble, and a large number of JMB booklets were also seized

from the 1st floor of the house. Meanwhile, at least five others were arrested in different parts of

the country in the last 24 hours ending at 8:00pm yesterday.

In another development, JMB's bomb squad member Abdur Razzak, who was arrested on Thursday night in Bogra, yesterday described to the police how bombs were exploded in Bogra town on August 17. KHULNA

A mass exodus from the deadly threat of Hurricane Rita emptied towns along the Texas and Louisiana coastlines yesterday, amid frantic last-minute preparations for the second super-storm in a month.

With Rita expected to hit the Gulf Coast late Friday, more than one million people piled into cars and buses with whatever they could carry, creating monumental traffic jams on all roads heading inland:

Bus blaze kills 24 evacuees

A bus carrying evacuees from Houston exploded into flames near Dallas killing at least 24 people yesterday, local television reported. Reporter Erin Allen of NBC tele-

vision affiliate KXAS in Houston said she spoke to a Houston nurse who was one of first responders at scene and managed to help driver pull several people from the bus before three explosions rocked the bus as the oxygen tank of several elderly passengers caught on fire.

"The sheriff's department says 43 people were on the bus and at least halfare dead," Allen said.

While no cause of the blaze has been officially determined there was some concern it may have been

tutors and the guards. The provosts and the house tutors are spending


