Search for victims goes on as Rita bill mounts

Rescue helicopters and boats waited for dawn yesterday to resume their search for victims of Hurricane Rita in flooded Louisiana communities as the bill from the natural disaster continued to mount even though the death toll remained low.

After the thousand-plus dead from Hurricane Katrina, only two people were reported dead from Rita though many people remain missing in small towns along the west Louisiana coast that bore the brunt of the 195km (120 mile) an hour winds and six metre (20 feet) high storm surge.

Military helicopters, coast guard boats and volunteers who brought their own craft scoured the worst hit towns and fishing villages that were cut off by floods. Up to 2,500 people were rescued

from Vermilion parish alone during the weekend, authorities said. More

One Vietnamese family rode out the storm on their shrimp boat in Intercoastal City. Many of the stranded people used cell phones to call for help Vermilion, Lake Charles,

Cameron and other towns are all near the Louisiana-Texas border and took a direct hit from the eye of the storm. Some of the towns are more than 25km from the coast but still suffered severe flooding. Rita ripped off roofs, sent trees

flying into cars, fanned fires through historic wooden buildings and flooded low-lying towns, but the region's vital oil infrastructure was relatively unscathed. Oil prices fell in special trading in New York on Sunday as fears that

3 robbers lynched in Comilla

Three robbers were lynched and two others injured by a mob on the Comilla-Chandpur road at Paranpur under Laksam upazila on Sunday night.

Police and witnesses said a gang of seven to eight highwaymen blocked the road with a car and started looting the passing vehicles.

Hearing the news, people from nearby Muzzafarganj Bazar and villages rushed to the spot and chased the robbers. They caught five of the gang and beat them up severely, leaving three dead on the spot and injuring two others. The identity of the dead could

not be known. On information, police went to the spot, recovered the bodies and sent them to Comilla Sadar Hospital

for autopsy.

Commerce College.

A total of 2,168 students appeared in the HSC examinations from Notre Dame College, out of which 683 candidates obtained GPA-5, followed by Viqarunnisa Noon College from which 1,098 candidates appeared and 307 obtained GPA-5.

From Dhaka City College 1,537 candidates took the exam and among them 168 secured GPA-5. From Holy Cross College a total of 150 obtained GPA-5 out of 499

A total of 728 candidates appeared from Dhaka College and 135 of them obtained GPA-5. From Ideal School and College, Motijheel a total of 912 candidates appeared out of which 133 obtained GPA-5.

From Residential Model College a total of 410 candidates appeared out of which 109 obtained GPA-5, From Rajuk Uttara Model School & College a total of 480 candidates appeared and 102 obtained GPA-5.

Among them 3,426 are boys and 2,083 are girls. Last year 3,036 students achieved GPA-5 and 1,848 were boys and 1,188 were girls. Besides, 23 madrasa students

under Madrasa Education Board and two from Bangladesh Technical Education Board secured GPA-5. Last year only 11 madrasa students received this feat.

Israel strikes anew after Hamas halts attacks

Israel launched multiple missile strikes in Gaza yesterday, hours after the main Palestinian militant group said it would stop attacking the Jewish state following Israeli air raids in response to rocket attacks.

A senior Hamas leader said on Sunday his militant group would stop launching attacks against Israel from the Gaza Strip, after Israel resumed its policy of targeting militant leaders in air strikes.

"The movement declares an end to its operations from the Gaza Strip against the Israeli occupation, which came ... in response to the assaults by the enemy," Hamas's most senior leader, Mahmoud al-Zahar, told reporters in Gaza.
