A large number of policemen have been deployed at Haji Danesh Science and Technology University (HSTU) here as students are agitating demanding removal of the Registrar and newly appointed 57 teachers and 208 staff, allegedly on political considerations.

Police were called when agitated after newly appointed Lecturer Faruque students after a procession on the Hasan of AED allegedly abused some first campus at about 9 am on Tuesday year students at a class. The students locked the administrative building and complained to Registrar Prof. Md. Abdul kept the Registrar confined in his room Mojid, but he allegedly ignored it. as he did pay any heed to their complaints against two teachers.
