A nearly three-kilometre stretch of Gobindaganj-Dinajpur road at Kaiyaganj has gone under two feet water, threatening movement of vehicular traffic now and snapping of communication at anytime.

The Water Development Board said the river Ghagot at Gaibandha is flowing 13cm above the danger mark and the Karotoa 46cm above the red mark at Gobindagani. The Brahmaputra is about to reach the red mark.

The Karotoa embankment breached at Bujruk Tengra and Chringa Jumarbari, leading to inundation of standing crops on about 700 hectares of land in Palashbari, the UNO said.

About three-kilometre stretch of the road between Gobindaganj and Ghoraghat is now under two to three feet water due to a breach in the Karotoa embankment at Taraf Manu, disrupting road communication
