The DCC has stepped up its drive against mosquito as more people in Farmgate, Green Road, Mirpur, Mohammadpur, Teigaon, Mogh-bazar, Shantinagar, Shahjahanpur, Khilgaon, Mugda, Sabujbagh and other areas are falling victim to the disease, the sources added

accused in the case began at the Court of District and Sessions Judge, Joypurhat, reports BDNEWS.

Earlier on September 3, police submitted the charge-sheet against the accused to a lower court, which sent the charge-sheeted arrestees to the district

Judge Narendra Chandra Das denied their bail petition and sent them to jail custody after fixing October 11 for full hearing. As many as 28 people have been

charge-sheeted in the case and 20 among them are now behind bars. KHULNA

The government yesterday finalised the policy guidelines for laying optical fibre cables across the country by private telecom operators to expand internet facilities at district and upazila levels.


The guidelines will ensure use or ownership of optical fibre facilities to be installed along roads and highways,
