stricken areas saw villages and towns flattened. Nearly every building in Muzaffarabad, a once-pretty river town that is the capital of Pakistani Kashmir, was destroyed or damaged.

Rescuers, many of them desperate relatives scrabbling with their bare hands, worked through the rubble in the hope that they might be able to save trapped people.

Medical experts say an unhurt man can last for three days without water and a woman four days, which means time is running out -- although in such catastrophes there are often stories of miraculous survival.


