GULSHAN-BANANI-BARIDHARA LAKE

Pollution turns severe as authorities sleep

The water in all parts of the Gulshan-Banani-Baridhara Lake has become very stinky due to severe pollution occurring under the nose of the authorities.

Sewage and waste from the residential areas of Badda, Shadatpur, Baridhara, Gulshan and Banani have been being discharged into the lake for years. Factors such as sedimentation

damaged the essential features of the lake, said environmentalists.

Rainwater during the monsoon washes away all the garbage and toxic material into the lake, causing death to a large number of fishes every year,

"Once we used to collect drinking water from the lake after it was dug 40 vears ago," said Alauddin Mia, a retired employee of the American

Embassy living in Gulshan, section No. 2. "Now we do not even dare to touch the water." he added

An inspection by The Daily Star on Sunday found that the bank at several parts of the lake has been covered with garbage and litters while the water has turned pitch-black. Wastewater was seen being discharged into the lake from several lakeside houses on roads No. 105 and 104.

Govt to set up 5 IPP plants in 7 months

PM unhappy over prevailing power, gas crisis

The government yesterday decided to set up five independent power pro-

ducer (IPP) plants, each having 50MW, in different places of the country as a quick solution to the ongoing power crisis.

Private sponsors will be asked to install the plants within the next 6-7 months so that the power supply situation in the next summer can be

The decision was taken at a highlevel emergency meeting convened by Prime Minister Khaleda Zia at her

Power sector survives major debacle

The power sector yesterday saved itself from a major debacle following sudden shutdown of two major power plants, as operators succeeded in restarting the plants

The country was officially having 580 megawatts (MW) of load shedding yesterday. If these two plants had not resumed operation, the load shedding would have reached 1150MW.

Power Development Board sources said around 11:00am vesterday the 360MW AES Haripur and the 210MW Ghorashal unit 3 power plants tripped abruptly.

"The Ghorashal unit had some problems with its cooling units. We are not vet sure what went wrong with the 360MW Haripur plant. But both of them resumed operation around 3:00pm," said a PDB source.

Yesterday the country's power plants had the generation capacity of 3340MW against an official demand projection of 3920MW.

minister killed in the insurgency after the power minister in 2000 and the home minister in 2003. Rebels have killed about a dozen former ministers

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh condemned the killing as "dastardly"

"The prime minister condemned the dastardly attack and said efforts to hamper earthquake relief work and disturb peace in the state will be thwarted," Singh's spokesman Sanjaya Baru said in New Delhi.
