Nations gear up for 4 US troops bird flu defence

Nations from Asia to Europe and the Americas stepped up their guard yesterday against the rapid spread of the bird flu virus, a day after Thailand reported its first fatality from the virus in a year.

A Thai farmer who slaughtered and ate a sick chicken became the world's 61st victim of the H5N1 avian influenza virus, which experts fear could cause a pandemic if it mutates into a form easily transmissible between people.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) said on its website that each additional human case was making it easier to develop human-to-human transmission and turn into a global catastrophe.

"While neither the timing nor the severity of the next pandemic can be predicted, the probability that a pandemic will occur has increased," the organisation said.

Thailand slaughtered poultry around the outbreak, and the dead farmer's seven-year-old son was being checked for the virus at a Bangkok hospital.

"Sometimes testing for the virus takes time. If the results are not clear, many tests are required so that our analysis is unambiguous," Thai Health Minister Suchai Chareonratanakul

In Europe, a preliminary test by a British laboratory showed no evidence of bird flu in a suspect turkey sent by Greece, but the continent remained braced against the virus's advance into Russia, Romania and Turkey.

The European Commission formally banned imports of pet birds and feathers from nearly all Russian territory in an emergency procedure, after an outbreak of lethal bird flu south of Moscow.

Ukraine's parliament slapped a sixmonth ban on imports of poultry and poultry products following the discovery of the H5N1 strain in neighbouring Russia and Romania.

Anti-graft chief held for graft

Vietnam's anti-corruption chief has been arrested over allegations he took bribes and abused his position, police said yesterday, in an embarrassing setback for the country's fight against rampant graft.

Luong Cao Khai, head of Vietnam's anti-corruption inspection taskforce and deputy director of the government's inspection department, was arrested at his home here on Thursday, an investigative police source told AFP.

The official, who was suspended earlier this month by Prime Minister Phan Van Khai, was appointed to probe state-owned oil and gas giant PetroVietnam between 2002 and 2003 but failed to prove any major incidences of corruption.

Police later uncovered several cases of serious wrongdoing.

"He is accused of receiving money and land from some oil and gas officials to use for private purposes and abusing his position to provide his relatives with jobs in oil and gas sec-

tor," the Tuoi Tre daily newspaper said

After receiving the money, he modified the contents of its inspection to underestimate the wrong doings his teams had uncovered, the paper said.

On Wednesday, seven oil and gas officials received sentences ranging from four years to life imprisonment

for being involved in falsifying a 17million dollar contract that resulted in millions of dollars in losses to state coffers. The communist regime has vowed to stamp out rampant corruption that permeates the government and state sector, and the National assembly is due to vote a comprehen-

Scientists have said east African Rift Valley countries Ethiopia, Kenya and Tanzania, along with Uganda, were particularly threatened as they host millions of migratory fowl that fly to warmer climes during the European

Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda put veterinary experts on high alert and imposed new bans or strengthened existing restrictions on poultry and wild bird imports.

Experts have warned that poverty stricken African nations whose populations are already at risk from hunger and vulnerable immune systems could be overwhelmed if the virus appears and jumps to humans.

Nigeria said it had sent vets to its northern wetlands to inspect migrating birds for signs of H5N1

Pamphlets have been prepared to warn farmers of the danger, poultry imports from infected countries will be banned and quarantine rules are set to A union representing Greek meat

sellers said sales of poultry had plummeted 60 to 70 percent since Monday due to the bird flu crisis. In France, a national federation of

supermarket chains said sales of poultry had dropped 20 percent in five days.

Albanian television said about 3.600 chickens imported from Greece had been buried alive -- thrown into a pir and covered by a bulldozer without any disinfection process -- because of bird

In Australia, authorities banned imports of birds from Canada after a scare caused by three pigeons certified as healthy by Canadian officials which tested positive for avian flu antibodies.

Hong Kong said Friday it was monitoring the outbreak of bird flu in China after warning it may close the border with the mainland if the virus begins infecting humans there. China announced its first reported outbreak of bird flu in more than two months on

In Washington the US Senate directed the Transportation Department to take proper precautions to deal with the possibility of an airline passenger flying into the United States infected with the virus.

Mexico said it was earmarking 46 million euros to buy vaccines.

BPC fuel stoppage

Dismayed at 'no initiatives' from Biman to pay the dues, Mahmudur Rahman said, "The situation has worsened to the extent that Sonali Bank has declined to open L/Cs for the BPC. I'll meet the finance minister on Sunday and apprise him of the situation."

He went on, "Forget about its (Biman's) outstanding fuel bills of Tk 500 crore, it is not even paying any heed to our inability to continue supply of fuel on credit. We expect that at least from now on Biman will buy fuel on cash.

There are many more like him. And as the capacity of government hospitals' 'social help' sections, funded by contributions from the government and wealthy donors, is very limited, it means poor people cannot expect much help from that side.
