Chelsea manager Jose Mourinho was adamant Friday he was not looking any further than the five-year duration of his current contract after the Premier League champions' billionaire Russian owner Roman Abramovich said he wanted to set in motion a 100-year dynasty at the London club

Abramovich revealed his longterm ambitions for the Stamford Bridge outfit when he wrote a foreword to Chelsea's newly-published official history

But the team's Portuguese coach said he did not feel under any extra pressure to deliver more trophies following Abramovich's remarks that he wants to build the most successful football club in the world.

Instead, Mourinho said he felt even less pressure than when he first arrived -- boasting he was the 'special one' on the back of his Champions League glory with Porto. Mourinho, whose side have won all

nine of their league games so far to this seasion to top the table by nine points from London rivals Tottenham, told reporters at Chelsea's training ground Friday: "For me the pressure is only for the next five years not for the next 100. "But having more pressure than

when I'm first arrived at the club, l don't think I will face again -- not in Chelsea and not in my future.'

# Jayasuriya okay
