Religious freedom a must for harmonious co-existence

Speakers tell discussion

Secularism does not mean denying religion, but the anti-liberation forces misled the common people into believing that it means atheism in order to spread an anti-Awami League propaganda, speakers at a discussion said yesterday.

They said secularism is an essential element of democracy and that religious freedom is a must for harmonious co-existence of people of different faiths.

Autocrat Ershad scrapped 'secularism', one of the main pillars of the constitution, in a bid to destroy the spirit of the liberation war, said Awami

League General Secretary Abdul Jalil. The situation worsened further when the BNP took the Jamaat as its partner to form the government, he said, adding that under the direct patronisation of the BNP, the antiliberation forces have started propagating that the AL believes in secularism, which means it wants to promote atheism

The AL is now planning to approach the people of all strata, particularly in rural areas, in a campaign to explain the true meaning of secularism, said the AL leaders



"Due to the lack of commitment and sincerity on the part of the (slum development) officials, the urban sanitation achieved only a .25 percent coverage rate in the last two years while the countrywide coverage rate rose to 59 percent from 33 percent during the same period," the ministersaid.

Teenagers are most vulnerable to Aids as most of them have no idea about how HIV/Aids is transmitted or how to protect themselves from the deadly disease, said the speakers at a seminar yesterday.

They said Bangladesh is at risk of a HIV/Aids epidemic as 48 percent of its total population are under 18 years.

The seminar on 'Aids: Youth Society' was organised by Life, a nongovernmental organisation, at its central office in the city. UNB Chairman Amanullah Khan urged the teenagers to come forward to gather knowledge about HIV/Aids

He said most of the youths have no clear knowledge about the deadly disease.

"The school-based awareness programme can break the wall of silence in school setting where free and frank discussions about sex is regarded as taboo," said Kamrul Hasan Sony, founding chairman of LIFE.

He stressed the need for creating an atmosphere where people can talk freely about HIV/Aids which is likely to kill 45 million people across the world by 2010. Dhaka University teacher Dr Rezaul

Hossain Bhuivan, Engineer Rezawan Hossain Mollick and Life Programme Officer Amirul Islam also spoke on the occasion.

Many of those Bangladeshis who have heard about HIV/Aids still do not know how to avoid the infection. Nearly 15 percent of married women who had heard about Aids did not know if there was any way to prevent

In South Asia, there are 110,000 children living with HIV/Aids of which an estimated 30,000 need antiretroviral therapy and 40,000 children are newly infected every year meaning that every day 110 South Asian children are infected.

In the region there are 1.3 million children orphaned by Aids and 125,000 pregnant women who need treatment

South Asia has some of the fastest growing epidemics of HIV and Aids amongst the groups such as injecting drug users, sex workers and their clients in the world.


