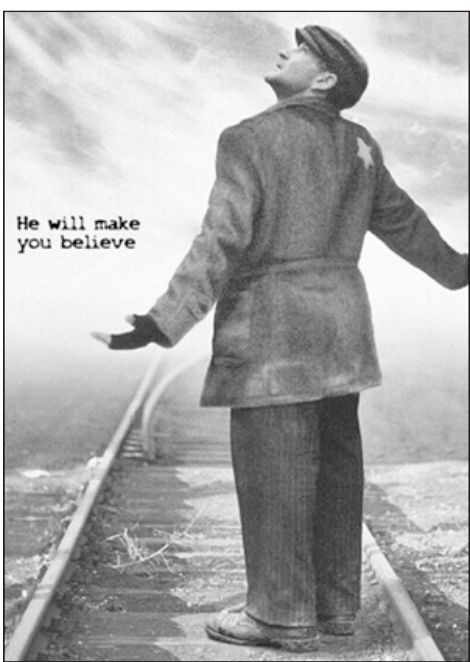

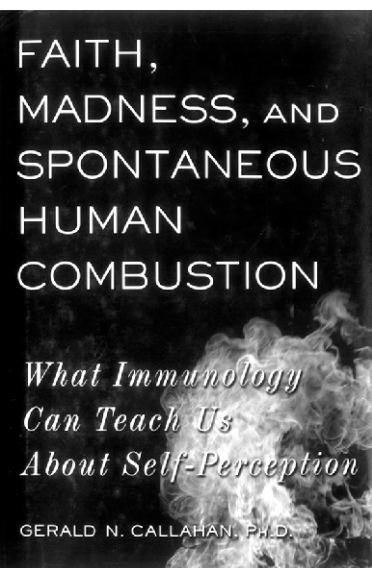
Faith, Madness, and Spontaneous Human Combustion

In this book, scientist and poet Gerald Callahan reveals what science has uncovered, sometimes unwittingly, about us where we begin, how we grow, why we die, and what comes afterward. An immunologist, Callahan dissects the immune system to reveal its most intimate underpinnings: the selves hidden inside our thymuses, the pieces of others lodged in our lymph nodes, the gift of human death, and the fires that burn inside our bodies. From the seemingly sterile voice of science come the words that define each of us.

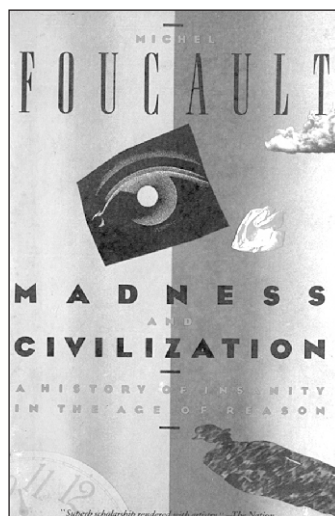
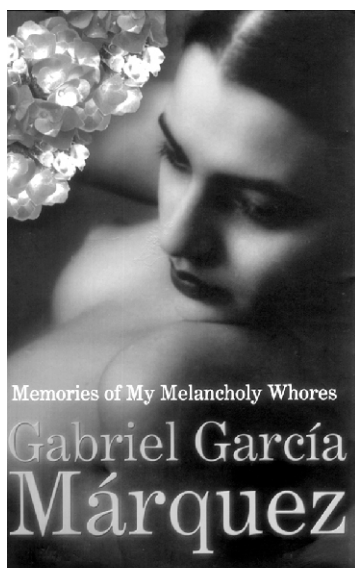


Memories of My Melancholy Whores

Memories of My Melancholy Whores is Gabriel Careia Márquez's first work of fiction in ten years and it fully lives up to the expectations of his critics, readers, and fans of all ages and nationalities. *Memories of My Melancholy Whores* introduces us to a totally new genre of Careia Márquez's writing. It is a fairy tale for the aged—a story that celebrates the belated discovery of amorous passion in old age. This enticingly sensual yet at the same time innocent adventure tells of an unnamed second-rate reporter who on the eve of his ninetieth birthday decides to give himself 'a night of mad love with a virgin adolescent'. In a little more than 100 pages, Careia Márquez proceeds to describe a series of encounters that is hypnotising and disturbing. When he first sees the chosen girl—a shy fourteen-year-old, whom he calls Delgadina—asleep, entirely naked, in the brothel room, his life begins to change completely.

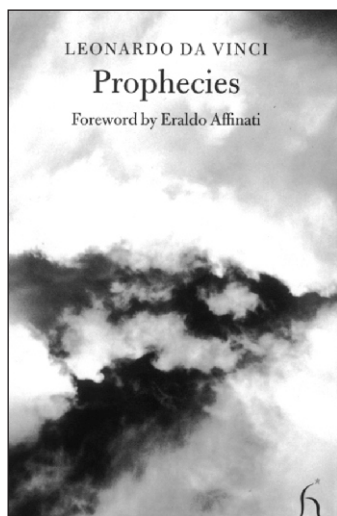


Madness and Civilisation

A History of Insanity in the Age of Reason

What does it mean to be mad? In *Madness and Civilization*, perhaps his masterpiece, Michel Foucault examines the archaeology of madness in the West from 1500 to 1800 from the Middle Ages, when insanity was considered part of everyday life and fools and crazies walked the streets freely, to the time when such people began to be considered a threat, asylums were first built, and a wall was erected between the "insane" and the rest of humanity. Foucault's book belongs, both by reason of its content and its pro-fundity, in the class of such treatises—at once historical, scientific and ethical—as Norman O Brown's *Life Against Death*.

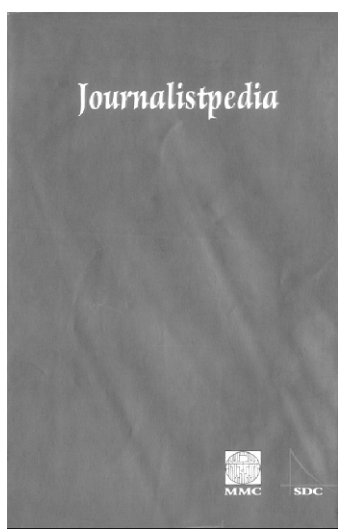

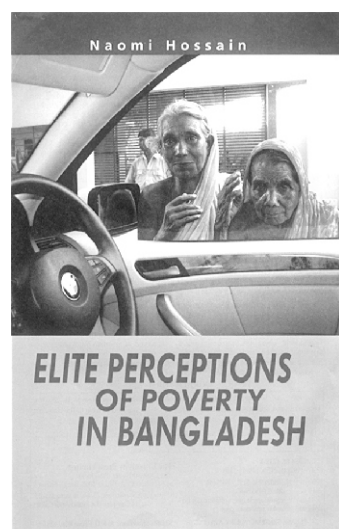


Elite perceptions of poverty in Bangladesh

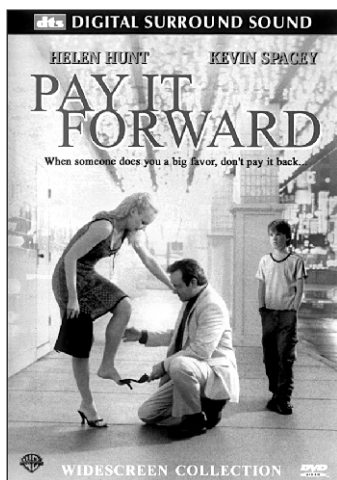

Based on original research, this book shows that poverty is not a high priority for the Bangladeshi elite, and attempts to explain why. The findings are surprising. Unlike comparable groups elsewhere, the contemporary elite is neither ignorant nor callous about poverty in Bangladesh: they are aware of the problem, show signs of sympathy towards the poor, and believe that tackling poverty is partly in their own interests. Yet their preferred solutions to poverty suggest it is not a priority: the problems of the poor compete for their attention—often unsuccessfully—with more prominent concerns.

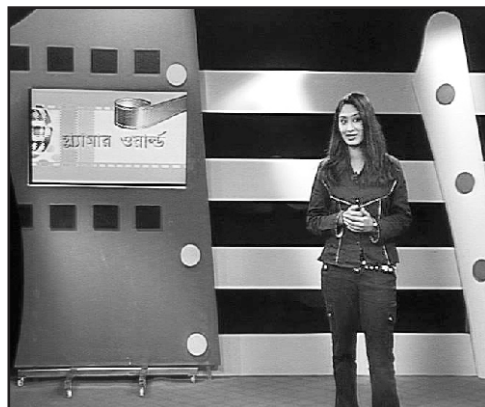
