The lawmakers have long been demanding that the right be restored to them, but Sircar rejected the appeal and advised them to consult the prime minister and the law minister about the matter.

"It is humiliating for parliament. Himself being the head of parliament. [the speaker] has allowed the executive to interfere in the parliamentary affairs," ruling BNP lawmaker Abu Hena said at a meeting of the parliamentary standing committee on private members' bills and resolutions on April 9 this year.

On the law ministry decision, the speaker on March 12 this year told The Daily Star, "Due to the lack of consultation, the lawmakers often move to place bills that cause embarrassment to the government.'

Infringing media rights, Sircar stuck to his position by not allowing the private television channels inside the parliament building for coverage of parliamentary proceedings or any briefing of the main opposition party.

The speaker has repeatedly defended this stand on security grounds, a lame excuse that has become a laughing stock as he allows the same private TV channels to cover his own media briefing at his office inside the JS.

Law Minister Moudud Ahmed at a discussion this month said he, however, is in favour of allowing the TV channels to cover the parliamentary proceedings. Sircar himself presided over the

House during the last four years, not letting the deputy speaker or any member of the panel of chairmen nominated at the beginning of each session to do the job.

However, once in 2003, the speaker allowed a member from the panel of chairmen to preside over the House, bypassing the deputy speaker although he was present in the parliament at that time.

Deputy Speaker Akhtar Hamid Siddiqui accused the speaker of violating the constitution and the JS rules of procedure, according to which, members of the panel of chairman are entitled to preside over the House only in absence of both the speaker and the deputy speaker.



"I was talking to a client when the blast took place. The blast took place about 20 metres away. Right after the blast, people were running here and there," said Sajjan Singh, shopkeeper, Paharganj.

A second blast was reported at Sarojini Nagar market, a congested shopping area in south Delhi popular for bargain purchases. Television pictures showed rescue workers pulling out a charred body from rubble in the market.

A third blast was reported at Govindpuri, a largely industrial area also in the south of the city.

"It was so powerful that it shook our police station which is some distance away," a police officer said of the third blast.

Police said a fourth blast reported by some local television stations was a hoax put down to firecrackers. **REDALERT DECLARED**

The explosions triggered a nationwide red alert and security was stepped up in the commercial hub Mumbai as well as other cities. Other markets in Delhi, a city of about 12 million people, shut down after news of the blasts.

People have been urged to remain calm and move away from crowded markets. Police have ordered all markets in the city to shut down.

Pakistan accepted Israel's offer, in a sign that the sole Muslim nuclear power was cautiously warming to better ties with Israel.

Prior to the earthquake, in a highly publicized sign of cordiality, Pakistani President Pervez Musharraf and Sharon shook hands on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly in New York in mid-September. Two weeks earlier, the two coun-

tries' foreign ministers met in Istanbul in the first-ever high level encounter which aimed to help normalize bilateral relations.

Pakistan had "decided to engage with Israel," its foreign minister said then, because Israel's pullout of settlers and troops from the Gaza Strip constituted a turning point for the establishment of a Palestinian state.

Israel currently has full diplomatic relations with only three Arab states ---Mauritania, Egypt and Jordan -- and a handful of Muslim majority states includingTurkey.

After the approval, the Power Cell will float the second re-tender for the project. Sources indicated that the bid criteria relaxation coupled with undue influence will help secure business for the brother of an influential minister who represents a Chinese company and an Irish-US company in Bangladesh.

The previous criteria sought the qualified bidder to have construction, operation and maintenance experience of at least one combined cycle plant of 300 megawatts. But the new criteria allows a bidder to show two plants of two sites totalling one 300 mw plant.

The previous criteria sought the bidder to have at least \$200 million in debt financing in the last 10 years. This has been lowered to \$150 million

To measure the financial strength of the bidder's consortium, the previous criteria allowed for the combining of the experience of raising debt and equity of members having at least 20 percent of the equity share. This has been lowered to 10 percent in the new criteria.

For determining the power plant development and operation, the previous criteria did not allow combining the experience of the members within the bidder's consortium. The Power Cell demanded that at least one of the members having at least 20 percent of the equity share fulfill the requirement of each of the technical criteria. The new criteria lowered it to 10 percent.

Both the home secretaries told the press vesterday that the talks were constructive with a positive frame of mind. There is goodwill on both sides and they will have to find ways to exploit it. Relations between the neighbours should be at their best always, they added. The neighbouring countries also

stressed the need for early signing of the agreement for co-operation in combating the menace of drugs and narcotics, particularly Phensidyle, said a joint statement issued yesterday after the talks held on October 27-28.

During the discussion, all issues were approached on the basis of mutual understanding and appreciation of each other's position and sensitivities. Both sides noted that the relations between India and Bangladesh are multifaceted and rich in its content and scope.

They recognised that further strengthening of these relations will not only be in the larger interests of the two friendly countries, but will also make an important contribution to the peace, progress and prosperity of all their peoples.

The two countries, they agreed, had a shared stake in enhancing understanding and promoting co-operation with specific initiatives in all key areas of their bilateral relations.

They agreed to work on security related issues closely. They also agreed that all possible measures will be taken to prevent smuggling of arms and explosives. The Bangladesh side clarified that media reports about India's involvement in the August 17 blasts do not reflect the official position of the Government of Bangladesh. The

Bangladesh side also mentioned that the investigation was on.

The issue of fencing at the border was also discussed. Bangladesh requested the Indian side to provide specific details of the places where fencing is proposed to be erected within 150 yards of the international border.

On trans-border crimes, the two countries agreed to the need for enhanced vigilance and action to contain trans-border crimes. They stated that neither of the governments encourages any type of smuggling and both are determined to effectively curb smuggling

The Indian side proposed a highlevel meeting to discuss the problem of 'illegal cross-border movement from Bangladesh' and to come up with a suitable mechanism or protocol. Both sides agreed to provide consular access to their arrested nationals on a reciprocalbasis

On resumption of the meetings of Joint Boundary Working Groups, Bangladesh has agreed to convey the dates for the early meetings of the JBWGs after Saarc Summit.

Regarding an extradition treaty and agreement on Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters, Bangladesh said it would expedite its response to the Indian proposals.

On review of Revised Travel Arrangements (RTA) signed in 2001, the Bangladesh side noted the Indian suggestion to set up a Joint Committee to review the RTA, which is due for revision in May, 2006

Various other issues of mutual nterest were also discussed in a spirit of friendliness and co-operation.
