# Bangladesh-Malaysia joint venture company on cards

#### Hajj pilgrims to get various facilities

A Bangladesh-Malaysia joint venture company will be formed soon to provide various facilities, including financial assistance, to Bangladeshi

The pilgrims can also avail themselves of the facilities during their stay in Saudi Arabia

The Ahsania Hajj Investment and Finance Company Limited will be formed by the government, Ahsania Mission and Malaysia Global Hajj and Global Corporation (MGHGC), according to a finance ministry

The government will have a five percent of the total share, while 51 percent will go to the Ahsania Mission

and 49 percent to the Malaysian company. According to the Ahsania Mission, the company will make an investment of 20 million dollars.

The Prime Minister's Office, the finance ministry and the Bangladesh Bank have already given a green signal for the establishment of the company.

Once the finance ministry gives its final consent, the Bangladesh Bank will initiate the process to issue a licence for the company.

Every year, about 50,000 Bangladeshis go to Saudi Arabia to perform Hajj. The pilgrimage involves around Tk 1.5 lakh, which many devotees, particularly middle and lower middle groups, cannot afford.

The company will initially target such people and launch a special

Presently, several private companies are engaged in arranging transportation of pilgrims and accommodation facilities for them in Saudi Arabia, but there are allegations of serious mismanagement and even fraud against these companies, said a religious affairs ministry source.

The new company will now arrange all facilities such as accommodation, transport, food and healthcare in the cities of Makkah, Madina, Mina, Arafat and Muzdalifa.

Although there are restrictions on permission for any new financial institution, imposed by the finance

### **Budget analysis unit** to be established in JS

A budget analysis unit would be established in the Jatiya Sangsad (JS) to ensure effective role of the lawmakers in the process of passing the national budgets by providing them with documents necessary to understand the trends of the proposed

The initiative on establishing the unit was taken under a joint project of Bangladesh Parliament and UNDP titled 'Strengthening Parliamentary Democracy (SPD),' said a concerned official at a launching ceremony of nine monographs on parliamentary studies yesterday. The function was attended by the

lish the budget analysis unit. "There should be an office for budget analysis to provide the law-

Mufti Abdul Hannan, operations commander of the banned Harkatul Jihad's Bangladesh chapter, was placed on a fresh three-day remand yesterday on charges of the August 17 countrywide bomb blasts

Detective Branch (DB) of police produced Hannan before the Court of Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Dhaka at 3:00pm on completion of the fiveday remand in the case filed for the blasts on the Dhaka University campus.

Two Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) members took the glum looking Hannan to the court of Metropolitan Magistrate Shafiqul Islam. Hannan was wearing a helmet and a bulletproof

The forwarding report placed by police before the court said Hannan gave nicknames of many involved in the bombings. He needs to be further guizzed for the details of those people, the report added, appealing for a further 10-day remand

Hannan told the court that he is sick
