Speakers at a workshop in the city have stressed the need for a coordinated efforts among the Saarc countries to prevent child traffick-

ing in this region. The workshop titled 'Role of civil society for combating child trafficking' was organised by Bangladesh Shishu Adhikar Forum (BSAF) at IDB Bhaban in the city on Monday, said a press release yesterday.
