

Traders fear another year of loss if winter is mild

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Markets such as Bangabazaar are buzzing with warm clothes display preparations as another winter approaches.

Sale of warm clothes is a seasonal business and speculation remains among traders whether sales would bring in good profits.

Clothes of vivid shades of red, blue, yellow and mixtures of other hues are being displayed to attract customers from all walks of life.

But the buying sprees are yet to begin, as people are uncertain of the duration of the winter season.

"People are reluctant to buy warm clothes for a 15-day winter as in the last few years," said Mohammad Nurul Islam, proprietor of Yasin Fashion in Bangabazaar. "We are assured of a profitable business if the winter lasts for at least a month," he added.

Wholesale traders and shopkeepers whined that they made marginal profits during winter for the last two years because of the mild winters.

On the other hand traders said they could not sell a large volume of clothes to their main customers, the footpath traders who were evicted for security reasons during the Saarc summit.
