WTO heavyweights set to review Hong Kong prospects

Top WTO negotiators were expected to release documents on Tuesday summing up the state of global trade talks before the body's key Hong Kong conference, as the heavyweights of international commerce tried to

New Zealand diplomat Crawford Falconer, who is trying to steer World Trade Organisation negotiations on farm trade out of their current impasse, and his counterpart Stefan Johanesson of Iceland, who leads talks on industrial goods, were due to issue drafts outlin $ing \, the \, state \, of \, play, of ficials \, said.$

With the WTO's Hong Kong minis-

away, trade chiefs from Brazil, the European Union, India, Japan and the United States were meeting in Geneva largely to focus on "process and manment", a diplomat told AFP.

The talks have been stumbling along for more than four years.

They were not expected to hold detailed discussions on enduring disputes, particularly over tariffs on farm goods, which are holding up the Doha Round of world trade talks.

"It is not a negotiating session and we're not expecting any breakthrough," said another diplomat.

Pascal Lamy, head of the 148nation WTO, is trying to craft an overall agenda for the December 13-18 Hong

Nailing down an agreement among the WTO's big hitters is seen as a crucial step towards an accord among the full membership.

After weeks of finger-pointing among the heavyweights, as well as prodding from other members including those involved in last week's summit of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) forum, there has been little to suggest that any lastminute compromise will emerge before Hong Kong.

Thailand posts trade deficit in October

Thailand posted a trade deficit ir October as imports grew faster than exports on the back of soaring global oil prices, the Commerce Ministry said Tuesday.

The October deficit reached 185.3 million dollars, reversing a trade surplus of 920.0 million dollars in September.

Exports rose 8.4 percent year-onyear to 9.57 billion dollars in October but imports expanded a bigger 18.3 percent to 9.76 billion dollars.

In addition to slowing exports, the trade deficit was caused by rising oil prices, which pushed the value of overall imports in October, the ministry said, adding that oil imports in the month surged 65.1 percent year-on-

"October exports were slower than expected. Among agricultural products, exports of rice and frozen chickens fell due to price competition with

"Also exports of agricultural products were affected by bird flu and slowing economic growth in our trading partners hit by natural disasters," the ministry said in a statement.
