

The organisers said the fair was geared towards bringing together education providers from the UK and Bangladesh and helping the students choose the right institution



A police constable who was injured in a road accident on Thursday died at the Holy Family Hospital in the city early vesterday.

Md Babul, 25, also a security guard at the residence of the state minister for home affairs, was run over by a taxicab at Shantinagar at around 11:00am on Thursday when he was crossing the road.

Local people rushed him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital in a critical condition, but on Friday he was shifted to the Holy Family Hospital where he died.

A case has been filed with Paltan Police Station on Thursday. Police has seized the taxicab, but the driver has escaped.

> Upon the government's withdrawal of the partial ban, other recruiting agencies that are members of Baira will also be able to send female domestic workers abroad, but will have to meet some stringent conditions.

A letter dated November 23 signed by a senior assistant secretary to the Ministry of Expatriate Welfare and Overseas Employment said Baira has to deposit a total of Tk 1 crore with the Bureau of Manpower, Employment and Training (BMET) on behalf of the recruiting agencies.

Baira will also have to set up a training centre with permission from the government and train the aspirant female workers at least for 30 days as per the standards set by the government, before their migration.

"It (Baira) will have to maintain a database of all the female workers and monitor their situation round the clock during their stay in a foreign country, through setting up safe houses under the supervision of Bangladesh missions in respective countries," the letter said.

cost The value of the bank certificates should be US\$ 550 for Saudi Arabia, and US\$ 400 for Jordan while the others who maintain minimum standards of employment may fix their own rates, the letter directed.

The letter emphasised that a committee comprising representatives from the ministry, BMET and Baira will be formed for continuous monitoring of pre and post migration management of the female migrant workers. The committee will meet at least once a month and report on their situation.

Baira may recommend only those agencies in the country, which will have joint agreements on migration management with the recruiting agencies or the employers in the receiving countries.


