Among the injured Supta, Mosharraf, Jahangir, Saifuddin and Majed were admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

Sources said the clash erupted at about 2:00pm during an alteration dated one loyal JCD activist Mosharraf to stay at room no 401 of the hall five days ago. Hearing the news Ehtesham went to the room and ousted Mosharraf and accommodated his loyal Nayeem.

In sequel to the incident the supporters of the two factions JCD were locked in the clash at around 2:30am in the early hours of yesterday.

Police rushed to the hall and brought the situation under control.

JCD DU unit General Secretary Saiful Islam Firoz told The Daily Star that they would take more punitive action against those who would be engaged in anti-organisational activities. "We urged the law enforcement agencies to take legal action against the trouble-makers," Firoz added.
