The idea of the BIMSTEC was first mooted by Bangladesh, India, Sri Lanka and Thailand at a meeting in Banakok in June 1997.

The aim, purpose and principles are contained in Bangkok Declaration adopted on June 6 in 1997 on the Establishment of the Bangladesh-India-Sri Lanka-Thailand Economic Cooperation (BIST-EC).

At the special ministerial meeting convened in Bangkok on December 22 in 1997, the Union of Myanmar was admitted to the grouping where it was decided to rename it as BIMST-EC (Bangladesh-India-Myanmar-Sri Lanka-Thailand Economic Cooperation). At the ministerial meeting in

February 2004, Bhutan and Nepal were welcomed as new members.
