### 34 get Australian scholarships

Australian High Commissioner Lorraine Barker said "Australia is pleased to be assisting Bangladesh develop its human capital, by offering 34 talented men and women the opportunity to access a quality education," says a press release.

She was speaking at the predeparture briefing session on December 5 for 34 Bangladeshis selected to study under the Australian Development Scholarships (ADS) programme 2006 intake.

Barker congratulated the recipients of the ADS scholarships. She said Bangladesh and Australia agree on the importance of human resource development and Australia is pleased to be able to provide the scholarships on a yearly basis to assist Bangladesh to develop its human resource capacity in key areas, including public policy and management, water management, education, gender, diplomacy and trade, public health and law.

Barker said the programme is a good opportunity to develop long lasting connections between the two countries

ERD Secretary Md Ismail Zabihullah said the programme will help strengthen the human resource capacity.

He said capacity development is an important area of development that has been identified in the PRSP. He urged candidates during their period in Australia to play a positive role as they will be the ambassadors of Bangladesh and will be carrying the image of their country.

There are approximately 62 Bangladeshi students now studying in Australia under the ADS programme. Of the awards, two scholarships were given to students of indigenous backaround.

SUSPENTION OF UNI-TRACK EDN **Publishers demand** compensation

Bangladesh Pustak Prokashak O Bikreta Samity (an association of publishers and sellers of books) submitted a memorandum to the government through National Curriculum and Text Book (NCTB) chairman demanding compensation for the loss they suffered due to sudden suspension of Uni-track Education System by the government.

They also demanded the order of publishing the books of private publishers approved for the years of 2005 and 2006.

Since the Uni-track Education was new to our country, the publishers had to face difficulty in selecting writers and collecting information.

When the publishers almost completed all preparations to publish books, the sudden decision of the government pushed them into

huge financial loss, they said. They publication sector will have to incur a loss of Tk one crore for the unjustified government decision, they claimed in the memorandum.

They also protested the comment in the cabinet meeting that the preparation to start the Uni-track Education was not satisfactory.

They threatened the government to take legal action if it fails to take necessary steps in five days.

President of the association Md Abu Taher, Vice President Md Tajul Islam, Director Bahauddin Bhuiyan and other leaders attended the meeting.

## **BCL** fails to form JU body in 4 years

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) failed to form a full-fledged Jahangimagar University (JU) unit committee in the last four years, which brought all activities of the organisation to a halt on the campus. The BCL JU unit activists could

hardly bring out any procession or carry out any national programme on the campus, rather it became a unit of giving press releases.

Since 2001, after the four-party led alliance government had assumed power, the BCL activists on the campus did not get any full-fledged committee to run the organisation. Low possibility of financial benefit from this chapter, intra party feud and teachers'

sources said.

Even after more than one year of the expiry of its convening committee, formed on November 27 last year with two months' deadline to form a new full-fledged committee on the campus. the central leaders are still fixing time to form a committee.

Ignoring root level activists' repeated demand of a committee, the central leaders did not form a committee fearing possible Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) harassment on activists.

Meanwhile, intra party feud among the BCL activists has come into surface with numerous groups and sub-groups working against one another. Refuting all allegations, Liagat

Shikder, president of the BCL, said, The committee will be formed in two days'.
