AFP, Wellington Australia's Andrew Symonds blasted a brilliant 156 to seal the one-day series against New Zealand Wednesday as the hosts' courageous run-chase fell just two short in a thrilling climax.

Australia recovered from a shaky start to post an imposing 322-5 but New Zealand chased to the very end, falling only in the final over when they lost two wickets and could score only three of the six runs needed to win

Captain Ricky Ponting said Symonds' innings, the third highest one-day total by an Australian and the biggest ever compiled against New Zealand, was "unbelievable". "You won't see many better than

that, you probably won't see any better than that at all," he said.

Symonds and Test reject Michael Clarke (82 not out) came together for a partnership of 220, the highest ever fifth-wicket partnership for Australia against New Zealand and one which appeared certain to put
