Presided over by the Awami League (AL) Chief Sheikh Hasina the rally was addressed among others by AL General Scretary Abdul Jalil MP, Abdur Razzak MP. Babu Suraniit Sen Gupta MP, Begum Sajeda Chowdhury, Tofail Ahmed, Obaidul Kader and Sheik Selim MP Workers Party President Rashed Khan Menon, its General Secretary Bimol Biswas, Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (Inu) chief Hasanul Huq Inu, General Secretary of Shammyabadi Dal Dilip Barua, former home miinister Mohammod Nasim. Gano Azadi League leader Advocate

Zahirul Islam, and Nurul Islam, Hasina said situation in the country is taking an ominous turn, as Khaleda Zia is unwilling to step down. Only a mass upsurge can force her to relinquish power and save the country from fanatic militant outfits, she said.

The sovereignty and independence of the country is now at stake due to escalating militancy and the killings of innocent people including judges, lawyers and policemen. There is no other alternative but to force the government of the four-party alliance to step down and save the country from being an abode of Islamist extremists, she said. Rejecting the offer for a dialogue

with the government on the issue of militancy the leader of the opposition said "People cannot betray the blood of those who were killed by Islamist militants. The 14-party coalition cannot sit with a government comprising antiliberation forces who are providing funds for killing democratic forces by forming suicide squads." She called upon the people to forge greater unity to get rid of the present situation for greater interest of the country.

Sheikh Hasina said Islamist militants have made threats to blow up different academic institutions, key installations and government offices in December to prevent the people from celebrating victory day.

She said an accused in the Jessore Udichi bomb blast case has been appointed as a cabinet minister. No murder case has been properly investigated during this regime, which obviously means that the killers are being patronised by the ruling party to destroy the democratic system.

She said prices of essential commodities have gone beyond purchasing capacity of the people. Mills and factories have been closed rendering thousands of workers and employees jobless. Members of law enforcing agencies are yet to be provided with better facilities including pay hikes. There is no security of life and property for the people, she said,

The AL chief said bomb and grenade attacks by militants are being launched in the country at the instigation of Jamaat-e-Islami, which is not unknown to the prime minister.

She asked Khaleda Zia to agree to the reform proposals put forward by the 14-party coalition on the electoral system and to announce national elections under a non-partisan caretaker administration.

She also said policies to run the government are being determined at

By 3:00pm there was no space on the ground and the roads leading to it covering more than two kilometres. Two hundred megaphones were arranged to enable the people to listen to speeches made by Shaikh Hasina

and other leaders of the coalition. One of the three stages in the venue was used for cultural programmes performed by prominent artistes who sand patriotic sonds from 10:00am to 1:30pm.

Khulna became a city of processions brought out by all member parties of the opposition coalition. The leader of the opposition was

given standing ovation by thousands of people when she arrived in the city noon with her motorcade and a strong private security escort.

Unprecedented security arrangements were made for the leader of the opposition. Three hundred volunteers of the AL were specially assigned to assist the police in maintaining law and order and to ensure peaceful holding of the rally.

The intelligence officials of Rab and the police swept the entire venue time and again with metal detectors. None was allowed to carry any bag, bring any bicycle or motorcycle in and around the venue

One hundred new check posts were set up in the city and two metal detecting gates were installed in front of the circuit house. Dog squads of RAB were brought from Dhaka for security checking. Local AL leaders claimed that it was the biggest gathering in recent memory.

transmission of hydroelectricity from Nepal and Bhutan to Bangladesh, assured and unhindered utilisation of corridors for trading between Bangladesh, and Nepal or Bhutan through Indian territory and effective measures to reduce trade imbalance between India and Bangladesh.

The fate of the tri-nation gas pipeline has remained uncertain from March when Delhi took a position that it would not sign any bilateral treaty under these three conditions with Dhaka in a tripartite agreement between India. Bangladesh and Myanmar, Earlier in February however, India had agreed on these conditions and signed a draft Memorandum of

Understanding (MoU). Quoting Indian energy ministry officials, sources also said that India changed its mind because the option of bypassing Bangladesh and importing gas directly from Myanmar turned out to be difficult. In such a case, India would have to install an additional 1000 km of pipeline through an insurgency infested and geographically tough region. Such options are very risky and also very costly.

The sources said if India imports Myanmar gas bypassing Bangladesh, the price of gas at Kolkata point can go as high as 6 dollars to 6.5 dollars per million British thermal unit (MBTU). This price would be 2 to 3 dollars lower if imported through Bangladesh where the pipeline length would be only 290 km. Therefore, this option has been finally discarded.

India is the region's biggest energy consumer that is perennially facing energy shortage. To stay even with its power demand growth, India must add 100,000 megawatt new power generation by 2020. This is why India is tapping all kinds of resources.

Officially India denied holding such a position but at the same time, it did not invite Bangladesh to hold the next round of meeting in March or April, as it was planned earlier. Instead, Delhi invited Dhaka in June to the follow up meeting--only a day prior to the event. Dhaka could not attend the meeting.

In August the then Indian foreign minister Natwar Singh visited Dhaka and held meetings with Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman and Energy Adviser Mahmudur Rahman that gave out positive signals. However there was no practical progress after that.

The trans-national pipeline project was conceived nine years ago. But following a political nod late last year, Dhaka moved ahead with it through a ministerial-level meeting in January.

As per the proposal, the pipeline will begin from Myanmar to transmit gas to India's Tripura and enter Bangladesh in the east to pass on to West Bengal.

Under this plan, Tripura will pump gas in the pipeline for transmission to West Bengal through Bangladesh. And Bangladesh can also add its own gas in the pipeline to transmit it from one point to another. Besides improvement of diplomatic relations. They also said there is no scarcity of blood and medicines in the
