

He batted against the formidable Pakistani pace duo of Wasim Akram and Wagar Younis as if he was playing in his 10th Test series, not the first.

Tendulkar did not take long to gain international fame. His hundred in England in 1990 and in Australia the following year reminded bowlers he would be a force to reckon with in years to
