"The Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) said in a statement that it had "upheld the requests for arbitration filed by the United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) in July 2004".

"As a consequence, both athletes have been declared ineligible for a period of two years starting on 6 June 2005.


