Another JMB cache found at Rangpur

Seizure list includes 24 grenades, huge bomb-materials

Law enforcers yesterday recovered yet another large cache of explosives and bomb-making materials and equipment from an abandoned sack on Lalbagh College Road in the northwestern town of

The haul included 24 homemade grenades, two time bombs, 50 power gels, 62 detonators, 20kg ammonium nitrate, three full and

147 empty cans of picric acid, 1,465 bullets, 3kg lead balls and 20kg of iron weights used in fishing nets. Besides, 25 books on Islamic theology and an assortment of laboratory equipment including a weigh-

ing machine were also in the sack.

The police yesterday also arrested two Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) members in Natore and one in Chapainawabgani, while Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) netted six sus-

pected militants in Bogra.

In Rajshahi, the four JMB operatives arrested on Friday confessed to the police yesterday that they would have made some bomb strikes in the immediate past if a number of JMB linchpins including its Military Commander Ataur Rahman Sunny RANGPUR HAUL

HuJi helped JMB carry out Aug 17 blasts

Ctg arrestees say letter for assistance sent last year

Outlawed Hurkatul Jihad (HuJi) had helped another banned Islamist outfit Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) carry out the August 17 bomb blasts across the country

Four arrested JMB leaders on Friday night told police and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) the HuJi helped them theoretically and provided training until August 17. The JMB top tier in 2004 sent letters to different Islamist organisations including the HuJi, who are based in Chittagong, seeking cooperation in launching its operations.

But only the HuJi based in Hathazari upazila had responded positively in no time, the four told the interrogators on the first day of their 10-day remand.

The remanded JMB men are Chittagong divisional chief Javed Iqbal alias Mohammad, Cox's Bazaar zone commander

India celebrate their third SAFF trophy with 2-0 win

India dethroned Bangladesh to regain the SAFF football title after six years with a 2-0 win in the final of the Fourth SAFF Championship at the People's Sports Complex Stadium here yesterday.

Midfielder Mehraj Uddin, the

most impressive player of the final and captain Baichung Bhutia, the player of the final and the tournament, struck either side of the break to end Bangladesh's superb run in the eight-team meet before a capacity crowd.

Taking the third SAFF trophy

home came as sweet revenge for India after losing the 2003 SAFF semifinal to Bangladesh who went on to win the title at home beating Maldives on penalties.

Bangladesh simply failed to carry on their form and style that took them to the grand finale and break the final-jinx against India, who have now won all four finals against their neighbours in regional tournaments.
