# Repair faults at plants for uninterrupted power supply

State minister tells Ctg PDB officials

State Minister for Power Iqbal Hasan Mahmud yesterday asked the Power Development Board (PDB) engineers to find out and repair the faults at the power plants in Chittagong to ensure uninterrupted power supply in the next

He also slammed the engineers for their negligence in properly maintaining the power plants, which are causing much suffering to the residents of Chittagong.

"Check your plants thoroughly this winter and diagnose the problems to make sure that there will be no interruption of power supply in summer," the minister said, referring to the repeated shutdown of two 210-megawatt Raozan plants, Shikalbaha plant and Kaptai Hydroelectric Plant due to technical

Iqbal Hasan said, "I don't want to see any trouble in any power plant in Chittagong nor do I want to see any news of power tripping appearing in newspapers. Money will not be a problem, but I want uninterrupted power supply in the summer. If necessary, take more time to repair the faults or submit plans. I will give money. The shortage of capital invest-

ment is a major setback for maintaining a balance between transmission and distribution of power, he said while exchanging views with the journalists at the PDB rest house

#### Loan defaulter arrested

Gulshan police arrested a businessman on Thursday on charge of forgery in taking loan from a private commercial bank. Police said they arrested

Monirul Haq Chowdhury, owner of "Call N Shop" in connection with a forgery case filed with Gulshan police station on December 22. M Shariful Hasan, senior

Principal officer of the Dhaka Mercantile Cooperative Bank Ltd, filed the case.

According to the First Information Report (FIR), Monirul received Tk 48.64.725 as loan from the bank against his two applications submitted on April 19 and July 28 last year.

Bank asked him for submitting original documents of his collateral within a week. Monirul had promised to submit the original papers, but he did not

As he had a good term with a section of officials of the bank, he was allowed to draw the loan without submitting any paper. He then applied for more loan, amounting to Tk 6 lakh, from the

He didn't return the money even after he was issued a legal notice by the bank on August 31, giving him seven days' time for the repayment.

Police produced Monirul before a court on Thursday. The court sent him to iail.
