"When we watched the repetition of that interview some days ago, we had the idea immediately. We want to include Maradona in the official squad," Mainoli said. "We know there is some time yet left to do it and we'd be totally proud of seeing Diego wearing our shirt."

Excursionistas will make its debut in the Apertura tournament in the final stage against Lamadrid on February 4 and will have nine games left until the end of the cham-
