First ever car designed by a Bangladeshi runs today

An enterprising youth today introduces Leepu F-21, the first ever automobile designed by a Bangladeshi, in Dhanmondi in the

Nizamuddin Awlia Leepu, the designer, formally launches the car at his workshop cum home on Jikatola New Road at 11:30am.

"I named the car after myself followed by F-21 that stands for February 21 [Ekushey February], International Mother Language Day," Leepu told The Daily Star last night.

Leepu has been working in automotive body designing and building technology since 1988.

He spent seven years in California in automotive culture to gather experience and expertise and since he returned home in 1998, he has been trying to improvise and innovate automobiles.

He said his ambition is to free Bangladesh from its shortcoming in automobile designing and help it turn into a designer-car country.

The Discovery TV channel will start filming a series of documentary on him and his career in February 2006

Besides, renowned British organisation Rich Mix in London has invited him to take part with his car in an international automobile exhibition in April 2006

NATORE ARMS LOOT Police stations in southwestern region put on high alert

All police stations, outposts and camps in the southwestern region of the country have been put on high alert following the incident of arms loot from Bamihal police outpost at Singra in Natore on Wednesday.

The DIG of Khulna Range has directed all police supers of 10 districts in Khulna division to watch out the situation round-theclock if police are performing duties properly in the police stations, comps and outposts.

There is information to police that underground outfits have again gained strength in the southwestern region taking advantage of ongoing operations against Islamic militants.

A total of 75 different kinds of firearms looted from different places by underground outfits in the southwestern region during the last six years are yet to be recovered

Twelve rifles were looted from on-duty Ansars on January 19 in 1990 from Akij Jute Mill at Noapara of Jessore district. On January 6 in the same year, 20 arms were stolen from Khulna court storeroom. Seven rifles were looted from on-duty Ansars in the Inter-city Express train on August 26 in 1999. On the same night, outlaws from a shop in Jessore town looted eight guns.

Underground outfits looted one SMG, one SLR, six 303 rifles and 260 rounds of bullets from Noukurha police outpost in Rajbari Sadar upazila.

Seventeen rifles, two SMGs, 180 SMG bullets and 1,280 rifle bullets were looted from Dattapara police outpost under Sadar upazila of Madaripur on July in 2002.

Govt conspiring to foil Trader shot, robbed of election: AL

Awami League leaders yesterday alleged that the hoodlums of BNP and Jamaat are launching terror attacks on popular leaders of the party in a bid to cling to power.

They also alleged that the alliance government is conspiring so that no impartial election could be held in the country.

The remarks came from a rally at Bangabandhu Avenue to protest the 'BNP attacks' on AL leader Akhtaruzzaman and others in Gazipur on December 27 and the death threat issued by the Islamist militants to AL presidium member Suranjit Sengupta MP.

The attacks and threats are not isolated incidents, the AL leaders said and accused the alliance government of resorting to such attacks in an evil design to eliminate Awami League leaders and perpet uate its misrule.

Presiding over the rally, AL presidium member Syeda Sajeda Chowdhury alleged that Prime Minister Khaleda Zia along with the

razakars' has been torturing the opposition leaders and activists.

'The more you (government) will intensify the attacks on our workers. the more they will be emboldened to foil all your conspiracies," she said.

Abdur Razzak MP said the alliance government does not want welfare of the farmers; they want to make Bangladesh a country of food

"The government has not taken any step against the militants who have killed scores of people through bomb attacks," he said. "Rather, the government is threatening to bring sedition charges against the opposition leaders who are protesting the militancy and who fought in the liberation war.'

AL presidium member Tofail Ahmed blamed the BNP-Jamaat coalition government for the soaring price hike of essentials and for plundering country's wealth and patronising the militants".

He urged the people of all strata to be united to topple the 'corrupt' alliance government.

AL General Secretary Abdul Jalil

was highly critical of the militant attacks, saying that the rise of the militancy has pushed the country

into conflict. They are trying to destroy the democracy and the achievements of the liberation war, he added.

Jalil said: "Our demand is the resignation of the alliance government so that a people's government and the rule of law can be established through an election under a neutral caretaker government.

Referring to the cancellation of the scheduled press briefing by the chief election commissioner on Thursday, he said this has "proved that the government lost its courage to speak the truth."

AL leaders Mohammad Hanif, Obaidul Kader, Dr Mostafa Jalal Mohiuddin, Mahmudur Rahman Manna, Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury Maya, Omar Ali, Habibur Rahman Khan, Bazlur Rahman, Alhaj Makbul Hossain and Haji Selim also spoke at the rally.


