

Lower court judges continue token protest

Judges of the lower courts across the country continued to wear black badges for the second day yesterday during court proceedings protesting government inaction to meet all their 11-point demand.

The Bangladesh Judicial Service Association (BJSAs) took the three-day token protest programme on December 21 at its 55th annual conference in case their demands are not fulfilled within January 10 this year. The protest programme, started on Sunday, will end today.

BJSAs 11-point demand include -- providing personal gunmen, tax-free vehicles and firearms for all the judges across the country, guards at judges' residences and payment of Tk 50 lakh each as compensation to the families of the slain judges in Jhalakathi bomb attack on November 14.

Road mishaps kill 14

At least 14 people were killed and over 170 people injured in road mishaps across the country yesterday.

At least six people including a mother and daughter were killed and 50 others injured in a road accident on Dhaka-Sylhet Highway in Brahmanpara in Osmaninagar yesterday, reports our Kushtia correspondent.

The accident occurred as a Comilla-bound passenger coach from Sylhet collided head on with a minibus from Sherpur around 10:30am.

Three people were killed on the spot. They are Fatema Begum, 30, wife of Jashim Uddin of Nabinagar upazila in Comilla, her two-year-old daughter Fahmidah Begum and an unidentified man in his 40s.

Lokman, 11, son of Aku Miah of Sylhet, Sumi Rahman, 19, of Tilagarh in Sylhet city and an unidentified man of about 30 died on the spot.

As many as 27 of the injured

were committed to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College and Hospital. The rest were sent to Balaganj Upazila Health Complex and other hospitals, police said.

MEHERPUR, JHENIDAH

Three people including a woman were killed and at least 40 were injured in two road accidents in Meherpur and Jhenidah yesterday, writes our Kushtia correspondent.

Police said a Meherpur-bound bus from Khalisahkundi in Kushtia collided with a truck on Kushtia-Meherpur Road in Akabpur and fell into a ditch around 7:00am.

Johora Khatun, 40, and an unidentified woman in her 20s was killed on the spot. The injured were rushed to a local hospital.

In Jhenidah, a Khulna-bound bus of Diganta Paribahan from Dhaka hit a bus of Keya Paribahan in Hatgopalpur in the morning.

Moksed Ali, 60, who was standing at the door of Diganta Paribahan bus, fell on the road and died on the spot.

Thousands stuck for thick fog

Cold claims 14 more lives in 5 districts

Fourteen more people died of cold and cold related diseases in Thakurgaon, Sirajganj, Patuakhali, Chuadanga and Dinajpur districts yesterday.

Five people died from shivering cold in Thakurgaon district, raising the death toll in the ongoing cold wave in the district to 27, reports BDNEWS.

The dead are Abdul Rashid, 45, of Patgaon village under Ranishankail upazila, Soleman Ali, 62, of Dangipara, Khadem Ali, 75, of Birhali, Pashiron Beowa, 107, of Bipara and Nurul Haque, 46, of Mitrabati village under Peerganj upazila.

In Sirajganj district, Aram Hossain of Aris Mohon village in sadar upazila, Moynal Fakir of Juggidaho, and Amina Parvin of Parkola village under Shahzadpur upazila, and Anowara Parvin of Motro Bororh village in Ullapara

upazila, reports our Sirajganj correspondent.

Poverty stricken people are suffering from the cold related diseases. Boro farming is also being hampered due to the intense cold and dense fog.

Azim Uddin, 72, of Sontoshdi village and Aleya Begum, 75, wife of Fazal Ali of North Muradpur under Dumki upazila of Patuakhali district died as the cold wave continues, our Patuakhali correspondent reports.

Our Chuadanga correspondent adds: Physically challenged Badal, 45, of village Narayapur under Liban Nagar upazila of the district died yesterday apparently from the severe cold that has been prevailing throughout the district for a week.

In Dinajpur, a one month-old boy, Zahid, son of Jahangir of Chirirbandar, and 40-year-old daughter of Azizur of Mission Road in the town died of respiratory problems, according to the UNB.

CTG ARMS HAUL CASE Hearing not held for illness of accused

Kuwait emir buried

Crown prince assumes throne

Sheik Jaber Al Ahmed Al Sabah, the emir of Kuwait and one of the United States' closest Middle East allies, was buried in an unmarked grave Sunday in a ceremony attended by thousands of weeping citizens who mourned the death of an admired ruler.

The crown prince, Sheik Saad Al Abdullah Al Sabah in his mid-70s and ailing himself assumed the throne. But he was expected to leave control of day-to-day government
