

Suicide bombers kill 69 at Baghdad mosque

Three suicide bombers killed at least 69 people and wounded some 130 others as worshippers left a Shia mosque in Baghdad after weekly Juma (Friday) prayers, in the second major attack on Iraq's majority community in as many days.

The blasts took place outside northern Baghdad's Barathra mosque where the imam, or prayer leader, Sheikh Jalaluddin al-Saghir, is an MP with the Shia United Iraqi Alliance, the largest bloc in the Iraqi parliament.

Immediately after the attack Iraqi authorities appealed on state television for public blood donations. A health ministry source was quoted as saying the bombings killed 69 people and wounded another 130.

An Iraqi security official told AFP that two of the bombers were disguised as women.

Iraqi and US military forces quickly cordoned off the entire area as dozens of pick-up trucks, ambulances and private vehicles started to ferry the victims to hospitals.

Victims were also carried away in handcarts and blankets, as men, beating their chests in grief, searched for relatives who had attended the prayers at the mosque.

Patches of blood and dozens of shoes were left scattered outside the entrance of the mosque where the bombers blew themselves up in the midst of the departing worshippers.

The triple attack followed a car bombing Thursday that killed 10 people in the Shia shrine city of

Najaf and came amid a political deadlock as Prime Minister Ibrahim Jaafari refused pressure to step down.

The latest bombings evoked the February 22 dynamiting of a Shia shrine in the northern town of Samarra that triggered Shia reprisals against Sunnis across Iraq.

Hundreds died in the ensuing tit-for-tat killings between the two religious groups, raising fears of civil war.

In Thursday's attack in Najaf, a car bomb exploded close to the revered Imam Ali shrine and near the offices of senior cleric Grand Ayatollah Ali al-Sistani and radical

"When media wrote about Bangla Bhai, ministers said he was a creation of the media, but now

Rivals murder AL leader in Kishoreganj

A local Awami League (AL) leader was killed by rivals within the party at Shadullarchar Bazar in Kishoreganj Sadar upazila around 2:00pm yesterday.

The victim, Shahidul Alam Khan, 40, was information and research secretary of Kishoreganj Sadar upazila AL. His father late Abdul Bakker Khan was a former upazila chairman and also an AL leader.

As Shahidul Alam reached Shadullarchar Bazar by a motor-bike, his rival group led by union AL leader Moazzem Hossen Rubel attacked him with knives and bamboo sticks, sources said.

He was taken to Kishoreganj Sadar Hospital where he was declared dead, hospital sources said.

ATTACK ON INDIGENOUS VILLAGES

Khagrachhari girls not raped, govt doctors say

Noapara and Chakrapara -- which the Bengali settlers attacked following a land dispute on April 3, still remains unusual.

Most of the indigenous people of the villages had not come back home until yesterday.

Most of the students of Shishughar, an orphanage home for Buddhist children in Sai Pru Karbaripara, also fled from the orphanage following the attack and

the school remains closed.

Although the injured indigenous girls, who were allegedly raped, were admitted to the hospital immediately after the attack, the medical board examined them on the morning of April 5, 48 hours after the incident.

"We tried to examine them but they did not agree. Later, people from their community convinced

Indian sugar seized, 7 held in Khulna

Khulna police around 6:30am yesterday recovered 1700 kg Indian sugar packed in 34 bags on a trawler in Skid Ghat and arrested seven people in this connection.

The arrested were identified as Shakil, Shahidul, Shahin, Alauddin, Motaleb, Khokon Molla and Shahadat Hossain.

Officer-in-charge (OC) Abdul Hamid of Khulna Police Station claimed the arrestees are members of a sugar-smuggling syndicate. Police also seized the trawler.

Nor'wester kills 4 in Sirajganj

Four people were killed and 250 others injured as nor'wester swept 15 villages in Kamarkhand and Kazipur upazilas of the district yesterday.

Local sources said the storm started lashing seven villages of Kazipara upazila at about 6:10 pm and continued for 10 minutes, killing three people and injuring 200 others.

The dead was identified as Karuna Begum, 35, of Khamar Baradul village. She died in house

Muslimpara, Boritali, Biyara, Megai, Sindabari, Charpara and Khudbandi.

Over 500 thatched houses collapsed and a large number of trees and electric poles were uprooted during the storm.
