Massive rigging alleged

Citizen's Committee candidate Mushfiqur Rahman Khan Hannan has brought allegation of massive vote rigging in the Manikganj byelection against the ruling four-party alliance. Speaking at a press conference at Dhaka Reporters Unity auditorium yesterday, he demanded recounting of the ballot papers in presence of all the candidates. Hannan claimed if recounted he

would win the election although the ruling party candidate Mainul Islam Shanta was declared winner by a margin of 12,000 votes. He alleged that his polling agents were driven out from all the centres. Apart from this, his supporters were intimidated and the administration detained the leaders and activists of the Citizen's Committee, he claimed. Hannan said although the presence of voters was thin, 70 to

80 percent votes were shown cast in three centres of the union from where the ruling party candidate hails, but only 40 to 50 percent votes were shown cast in other centres. He said complaint was lodged with the returning officer immediately but he did not accept it. A written complaint will be filed with the Election Commission Office in this connection tomorrow, he added.

Final of English debate contest in Ctg today

In the semi-finals held yesterday, William Carey Academy defeated Oxbridge International School while Summer Fields School beat Elementary School. The motions of parliamentary-style debates were "Developed countries are mainly responsible for violation of human rights" and "The expansion of information and communication technology (ICT) in Bangladesh is mainly hindered by our unskilled manpower rather than our infrastructural shortcomings". Tasmia Hoque of William Carey Academy and Amit Bhattacharjee of Summer Field School and College were adjudged the best debaters. Bangladesh Debate Federation Joint Secretary Adnan Mannan was the speaker of the debates and USTC lecturer Sazzad Hossain Zami and debater Dr Masud Rana were the judges.

Hasina, Ramesh discuss bilateral trade

Visiting Indian State Minister for Commerce Jairam Ramesh yesterday met with the Leader of the Opposition in Parliament and Awami League (AL) President Sheikh Hasina and discussed bilateral trade and economic cooperation. After an hour-long meeting at Hasina's Sudha Sadan residence in the city, Ramesh told the journalists that it was a courtesy call where he discussed bilateral issues especially the economic ties between the two countries. "I have informed her of the progress of Safta at the Saarc Commerce Ministers' meeting in Dhaka when the opposition leader wanted to know," he added. Briefing the journalists, AL Presidium Member Kazi Zafrullah MP said the Indian minister came only to call on the opposition leader as he did not meet her earlier. He had discussed with her the possible ways to strengthen bilateral relations between the two close door neighbours. Another AL Presidium Member and former commerce and industry minister Tofail Ahmed said they told the Indian minister that the AL is not against bilateral FTA with India, and it could be done protecting the interest of Bangladesh. Tofail said they also discussed how to reduce Bangladesh's trade imbalance with India. Obaidul Quader, AL's acting general secretary, said the Indian minister wanted to see Bangladesh an economically strong country. AL leaders Abdur Razzak MP and Indian High Commissioner in Dhaka Veena Sikri were also present in the meeting.
