General Manager of the BB Rafiul Alam will now monitor credit disbursement of IFIC bank.

The observer will attend board

meetings of the bank and monitor any irregularities in its operations.

The BB took the step in the light of happenings at Oriental Bank following change of its ownership.

New directors of the Bank allocated huge loans in favour of them.

Seven persons including a ruling BNP lawmaker and businessmen, who bought sponsor shares of IFIC Bank from its previous directors,

have been elected its new directors. They are Mosaddek Ali, MP, Hossain Al Masum, chairman of Jubok Housing & Real Estate Development Ltd, Sabih Ul Alam, director of Jubok Ceramic Industries Ltd, Lutfar Rahman Badal, Shahidul Haque, Enayetur Rahman and Masud Reza Bhuiyan.

Teachers keep
on agitating
for pay hike
Strike enters day 6

Mob lynches 1 during robbery attempt

A mob lynched one and injured another in the city's Motiheel area yesterday for allegedly trying to commit robbery at house at Arambagh in the capital.

The dead was identified as Kalu Mia, 35, and the injured is Md Polash, 32.

A gang of three—Kalu, Polash and Siddique—posing as police stormed into an apartment at a five-storied building around 1:00 am. As they carried sharp weapons, inmates of the house became terrified and cried for help. At this, neighbours rushed to the spot.

The gang then stabbed an inmate, Afzana, to create panic and flee. They first ran to the roof of the building. Kalu jumped to another building and got injured. Locals then beat him to death.

EC to 'display' updated
voter list, but says it
won't publish draft

The Election Commission (EC) yesterday decided to make the updated voter list, prepared through door to door visits, open to the public for inspection before publishing the final list.

The move is an obvious compromise between the popular demand for publishing a draft voter list and Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) MA Aziz's staunch resistance to publication of a draft list.

Meanwhile, the EC is not terming the 'voter list on display' as the draft voter list saying that the procedure being applied for updating the

Violence kills 36 in Iraq despite PM's unity call

At least 36 people were killed across Iraq in bombings, shootings and gunbattles yesterday, including 10 Shias gunned down in an apparent

sectarian attack in Baghdad.

The raging violence has raised renewed fears that the country is sliding towards civil war, prompting Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki to issue an urgent appeal for unity.

In Tuesday's deadliest attack, 10 Shias carrying a coffin in a minibus were ambushed and shot dead by gunmen on a highway near Baghdad's notorious Sunni

than 50 Palestinians in a week. Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert defended the operation, aimed at securing the release of an abducted teenage soldier and halting rocket attacks, despite
