

## 'Italy wont be complacent'

World Cup-winning captain Fabio Cannavaro insisted that Italy will not be lacking in motivation for their 2008 European championship campaign.

Italy take on Lithuania in Naples next Saturday before facing France - the team they beat on penalties in Berlin last month to become world champions for a fourth time - in Paris the following Wednesday.

Raising morale after hitting such a high in Germany will be a tall order for the Azzuri, but the imperious Cannavaro said they will not rest on their laurels.

"After winning the World Cup it would be understandable if there was a bit of complacency, but we are now thinking about our next target and we want to win the European championships," said the 32-year-old Cannavaro Monday, who left Juventus to join Spanish giants Real Madrid last month after the Turin club were found guilty of match-fixing.

"We haven't won the European championships for a long time and it's about time we did."

Italy have won the European championships just once, in 1968, when they hosted the tournament.

They have played one friendly since their triumph in Germany but new coach Roberto Donadoni picked a reserve team and they lost 2-0 at home to Croatia.

## Odonkor set for Betis

Borussia Dortmund announced Monday they have reached agreement to transfer German international midfielder David Odonkor to Real Betis in Spain.

Borussia's sporting director Michael Zorc said the "negotiations were successful" but that the deal would only be sealed once Odonkor had completed a medical on Monday.

The 22-year-old Odonkor was tied to Borussia until 2008, and will be transferred for a fee of "more than six million euros", according to Zorc.

Odonkor was given a late call-up to Germany's squad for the World Cup, but impressed many in the tournament with his turn of speed.

Despite boasting a similar reputation in the Bundesliga, Odonkor - capped six times for Germany - has been a substitute for Borussia during two of their league matches so far this season.

## Martins relief for Newcastle

Newcastle's new 10-million-pound signing Obafemi Martins should be fit to face Fulham a week on Saturday despite suffering a knee injury during his Premiership debut at Aston Villa on Sunday.

The Nigerian, who only arrived from Inter Milan on Thursday, was stretchered off during the second half of the 2-0 defeat at Villa Park.

It looked like the injury might be serious, but boss Glenn Roeder breathed a sigh of relief when he learnt that Martins would not be joining long-term casualty Michael Owen on the sidelines.

"He has been in some discomfort but we think it is just a nasty dead leg where he will have had a bleed in the muscle," Roeder told the Newcastle official website.

"He will be sore for a few days, but we don't think there will be any problems with regards to the next game against Fulham."

## Marseille go top

Marseille reclaimed top spot in the French League on Sunday when a 2-0 win over Le Mans completed a memorable week in which they also reached the knockout round of the UEFA Cup.

Marseille have 10 points and took top place on goal difference from champions Lyon who beat Nice 4-1 on Saturday.

They were indebted to two substitutes for their opening goal which came after 70 minutes when Samir Nasri played a wonderful pass for Habib Barmogo to score.

Mamadou Niang then sealed the three points from the penalty spot 10 minutes from time after he had been chopped down by Gregory Cerdan.

"We knew that Le Mans could be capable of scoring goals and be difficult to play against," said Marseille coach Albert Emon.

"But we thought about what we had to do and we had great confidence. It pleased me to see the joy in the players."

Nancy went into fourth spot, just a point off the pace, thanks to a 1-0 win over Auxerre, the victory secured by a

73rd-minute strike from Benjamin Gavanon.

Saint-Etienne also have nine points after a 3-2 home win over Lens.

Monaco had a first win of the season beating Sedan 2-1.

Mohamed Kallon (31min) and Francois Modesto (43) were on target for Monaco with Mansour Boutabou grabbing an 83rd-minute consolation.

On Saturday, Lyon, seeking a sixth consecutive French title, had temporarily taken top spot with a come from behind win at Nice who took a 1-0 half-time lead through Marama Vahirua.

But goals from Florent Malouda, Tiago and a brace from Karim Benzema sealed a third straight victory for the champions on their travels this season.

Sochaux stunned visitors Paris St Germain 3-2.

Karim Ziani opened the scoring for the hosts in the 29th minute, and six minutes later Badara Sene had doubled their lead.

Portugal striker Pauleta grabbed a brace late in the match to level, taking his goals tally to 121 to surpass Lilian Laslandes as the French league's highest goalscorer still playing.

However, Pauleta and PSG's joy was ended by Ziani when he stepped up to convert from the penalty spot 10

minutes from time to wrap up the points.

Lorient grabbed a 3-1 win over Nantes with striker Andre-Pierre Gignac grabbing a first-half debut hat-trick.

Canaries striker Frederic Da Rocha waited only 10 minutes before levelling Gignac's opener in the second minute, however Nantes' joy was short-lived as Gignac added goals in the 15th and 28th minutes.

Lille maintained their tradition of enjoying a solid start to the season with a 3-0 whitewash at home to Bordeaux to go third with nine points.

Yohan Cabaye, Mathieu Bodmer and Peter Odemwingie were on target.

## 'Slave' claim strong but logical

Claude Makelele believes Chelsea manager Jose Mourinho was too strong but logical when describing him as a 'slave.'

The Blues boss was reacting to Makelele being picked against his will for the French national team by coach Raymond Domenech.

Makelele announced his international retirement for the second time after the World Cup in Germany in July but Domenech did not accept his decision.

Domenech has called him up ahead of France's Euro 2008 qualifiers

against Georgia and Italy on September 2 and 6, and Makelele has now agreed to play.

Mourinho said yesterday: "Makelele is not a football player - Makelele is a slave."

But Makelele told French television station TPS: "My coach's words are a bit too strong, he's probably gone too far."

"But his disappointment is logical. There was an agreement after the World Cup that would retire.

"But I will go to Clairefontaine (the France training camp) and I will be there for the two matches. I consider it normal to wear the colours of my country."

The French team gather in Clairefontaine tonight.

Makelele, 33, admits the workload of club and country games will be taxing.

This is a delicate situation because I will play more matches and I will be more tired," he said.

"But I am in the list and I have to go. The French team is still something important for me.

"Everyone knows me and I am a professional, I do my job and even if my club is not happy I will honour my call-ups."

## Ferdinand fit for qualifiers

Defender Rio Ferdinand has been passed fit for England's Euro 2008 qualifiers with Andorra and Macedonia.

It was feared the 28-year-old had broken a toe in Manchester United's Premiership win over Watford on Saturday and would therefore miss Steve McClaren's first competitive game in charge of the national side.

But a scan carried out on Sunday suggested there was only bruising

rather than a break and further examination on Monday has left United's medical staff able to pass Ferdinand onto their England counterparts.

The news will be a major boost for McClaren, who faced the prospect of having to re-jig his defence for the Andorra and more hazardous Macedonia games.

Although the former West Ham player will still need his fitness assessed before being given the all clear to start Saturday's Old Trafford encounter, United are much more relaxed about the situation now McClaren is in charge.

Confirmation that Ferdinand will

not be out of action for up to six weeks, as had been feared, also represents a real boost for United boss Sir Alex Ferguson.

United have started the season on top form, as they currently head the Premiership after winning their first three games.

But Ferguson has only too aware his side made a similar start 12 months ago, only to see their hopes of challenging Chelsea undermined by a series of long-term injuries, which so far this year they have managed to avoid.

United are still in the hunt for qualification, but the one consolation was new £10million signing Obafemi Martins' injury was not as serious as first feared when he was carried off on a stretcher after an hour.

Relieved Magpies boss Michael O'Neill said: "We have been very lucky. He has suffered a heavy dead leg. When he was stretchered off I thought it could be a serious knee injury but he expects him to be fit for our next game with Fulham."

Roeder admitted: "The players will be disappointed with the goals they conceded. There were individuals who should have done better."

## Chelsea slam Schwarzer claims

Chelsea have described Middlesbrough goalkeeper Mark Schwarzer's claims that the champions lacked 'respect' following his side's midweek draw as 'complete nonsense'.

The Australian keeper hit out at the Blues over the weekend accusing Jose Mourinho's side of lacking class and claiming the players left the pitch without shaking hands following Boro's 2-1 win at the Riverside Stadium.

Chelsea have issued a statement in response which read: 'The comments from the Middlesbrough goalkeeper are complete nonsense and totally ignore the facts on the night.'

"Several Chelsea players swapped shirts with Middlesbrough players after the whistle and Jose Mourinho stood by the side of the pitch after the Chelsea team had already gone to the dressing room and shook the hands of most, if not all, the Middlesbrough players."

"One has to question Schwarzer's motives for coming out with this unwarranted attack on our players and manager given they are not borne out by the clear facts."

"We delayed our response to this because we had an important match against Blackburn and we did not want this issue clouding the build-up to the game, but we cannot allow this attack to go unanswered."

Chelsea beat Blackburn 2-0 at Ewood Park on Sunday.

## Van der Vaart out of Dutch match

Injured midfielder Rafael van der Vaart has been ruled out of the Netherlands' Euro 2008 qualifier against group G opponents Luxembourg, his club, SV Hamburg, said Monday.

The 23-year-old Dutch skipper of the Bundesliga side injured his thigh playing in the 1-1 draw with Hertha Berlin on Sunday and will be unavailable for Saturday's match in Luxembourg.

Van der Vaart is set for a scan on Monday to find out the extent of his injury.

## Villa chief delighted with win

New Aston Villa owner Randy Lerner could not conceal his delight after watching Martin O'Neill's side climb to second spot in the Premiership by defeating Newcastle at Villa Park.

Lerner and his family flew over from the United States and received a standing ovation from the Villa fans before witnessing goals from Luke Moore and Juan Pablo Angel maintain an unbeaten start to the campaign.

The 44-year-old Lerner was introduced to some of the Villa players by outgoing chairman Doug Ellis after the game and will now sit down with O'Neill to discuss transfer targets before the window closes at midnight on Thursday.

Lerner, the billionaire owner of NFL side Cleveland Browns, said: "What a great start that was. My family has enjoyed it, particularly with Villa scoring within two minutes of the kick-off."

"They didn't waste anytime and the crowd were chanting my name. That was great. I thank them for that."

"The whole afternoon gave me a nice warm feeling. It underlined to me why exactly I am so happy to be buying into English soccer. It is a great club."

O'Neill said: "I haven't sat down with Mr Lerner yet. I will do hopefully in the next day or two. He is staying on in England for a little while."

"Before the transfer window closes we are going to try and do something. The good players at the club need a bit of help and it would be really important for us to get some people in - even if they are on loans."

"There is some momentum there at present. We have got seven points and for club to make a signing or two would be nice if that is the case. If that is not material, then we still try and get some people in - even if they are on loans."

"We will try and do something because the squad does need bolstering. All thoughts will be on that between now and Thursday evening."

On an almost perfect day for Villa, new skipper Gareth Barry pledged his future to the club by signing a new four-year deal after coming close to asking for a transfer in the summer.
