

Nothing to be done beyond constitution

CA tells European Commission team

UNB, Dhaka

President and Chief Adviser Prof Iajuddin Ahmed yesterday categorically said that nothing is to be done beyond the constitution regarding the Election Commission.

He cleared the caretaker government's stance apparently on the critical question of removing CEC Justice MA Aziz during a meeting with a delegation of the European Commission, comprising ambassadors and high commissioners, at Bangabhaban.

Iajuddin said his caretaker government has already taken various steps for holding the coming general election "in a free, fair and neutral manner".

He also informed the European diplomats that his interim government is holding discussion with all

19 changes at DS level

The interim government last night cancelled contractual government jobs of 29 officials including the jobs of three secretary-rank officials, and made 19 changes in deputy secretary level posts.

Nine deputy secretaries were transferred, eight OSDs (officers on special duties) were posted in different ministries, and two other officials were placed on deputation.

There is however about 200 more officials working on contracts.

Be tough, proactive

Nobel hero Yunus urges chief adviser at Bangabhaban reception

Nobel Peace Laureate Prof Muhammad Yunus yesterday urged the president and chief of the caretaker government to be tough and proactive in running the country.

"You will have to be very tough, otherwise the nation will plunge into darkness. But you must be tough on all, not only on some particular ones," he said speaking at a grand reception accorded by President Iajuddin Ahmed for winning Nobel Peace Prize in 2006.

"It's a hard time for the nation and the people want to see an active and courageous leadership," he observed.

"Set a precedent dealing with at least one area of massive corruption facing the nation during the tenure of the caretaker government," he headed.

He then described power situation, price of essentials, Chittagong port, and law and order as the areas most prone to crisis.

He also urged the president to listen to everyone but take decision on the basis of his own reasoning.

Yunus called on the advisers of the caretaker government also to set at least one example of ridding a sector of corruption.

Held at the Darbar Hall of the Bangabhaban amid tumultuous applause at intervals, the maiden state reception was attended by caretaker government advisers, former ministers, secretaries, diplomats, political leaders, artists, literati, and civil and military officials.

Yunus won the peace prize on August 13.

Khaleda's portrait at last removed from EC

Portraits of former prime minister Khaleda Zia were finally taken down yesterday afternoon from the conference room of the Election Commission (EC) seven days into the power handover by the BNP-led four-party alliance.

The photograph was removed from the wall after a journalist drew the EC secretary's attention to it during a press conference organised at the EC conference room.

"I am sorry, very sorry that the picture was not removed yet," said Secretary to the EC Abdur Rashid Sarker when a journalist pointed to the government order of removing photographs of the previous premier from government offices.

"It's unfortunate," he added. The EC secretary reprimanded the EC officials and instructed to take the photograph down immediately.

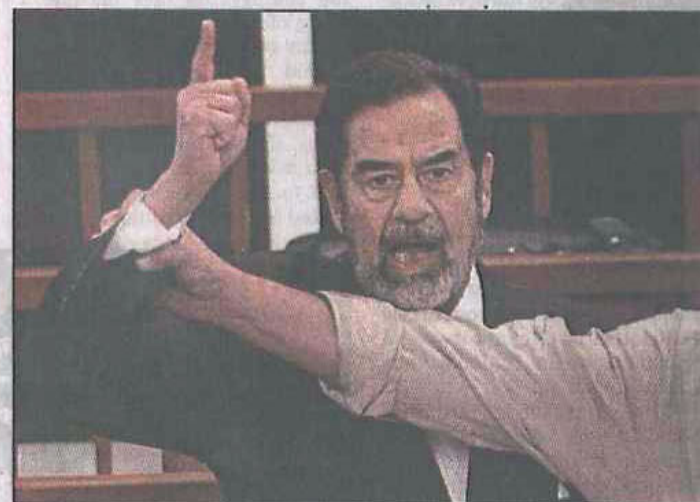
Saddam, half brother sentenced to hang

AGENCIES, Baghdad

A visibly shaken Saddam Hussein was found guilty of crimes against humanity yesterday and sentenced to hang by the US-sponsored court that has been trying him in Baghdad for the past year.

Two other senior aides, including his half-brother Barzan al-Tikriti, will also hang if automatic appeals fail in the coming months. His vice-president was jailed for life and three minor officials of his Baath party were sentenced to 15 years.

Shortly after the verdict was read out at noon (0900 GMT) in a heavily fortified Baghdad courtroom that was once a Baath party office, clashes broke out between gunmen and US and Iraqi troops in two Sunni Muslim neighborhoods of the capital.

VOTER LIST Mistake rectification not possible for time pressure

The Election Commission (EC) yesterday informed the caretaker government chief that it is not possible to correct the mistakes in the controversial updated voter list due to constraints of time.

After wasting at least six months

in the voter listing job, the EC now plans to hold the upcoming parliamentary election using the 'flawed' list as it maintains, it does not have any other alternative.

CA orders security beef-up

14-party asks BNP not to pressurise CG

The Awami League-led 14-party alliance yesterday urged opponent BNP-led four-party coalition not to pressurise the caretaker government but help it create a congenial atmosphere for holding the upcoming general elections in a free and fair manner.

Awami League (AL) General Secretary and 14-party Coordinator Abdul Jalil alleged that the four-party alliance placed its 10-point demand to the caretaker government as part of a conspiracy to foil the next election.

At a press conference at the AL Dhanmondi office, Jalil also urged BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia and Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan not to try to protect the

"controversial" chief election commissioner (CEC) and three other election commissioners.

He accused the BNP and its alliance partner Jamaat-e-Islami of creating pressure on Chief Adviser to Caretaker Government Iajuddin Ahmed for holding a "blueprint" election and asked the people to resist any such election under the current Election Commission (EC).

The 14-party will stage country-wide demonstrations on November 8 to press home its demands for reconstitution of the EC and protest BNP-Jamaat's "criminal activities".

Reiterating their demand for immediate removal of the CEC, three election commissioners, the EC secretary and 300 upazila election officers by November 11, Jalil

An operative of banned Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) has told a Sunamganj court that he would have been very happy if he had killed Awami League (AL) Presidium Member Suranjit Sengupta.

At the court of First Class Magistrate Hazera Khatun on Friday, Naim alias Hafiz admitted responsibility for the bomb blast at a public rally of Suranjit five years ago.

He said that the AL leader was their target and he was sorry that he could not kill him.

The blast on July 21, 2001 left one killed and 50 others injured. Naim alias Hafiz was produced before the court amid tight security. Investigation Officer Sri Ram
