

## Ensuring fair polls only way to resolve crisis: CPB

Ensuring a free and fair election with the participation of all political parties to establish an elected government is the only way to resolve the existing crisis, said Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) General Secretary Mujahidul Islam Selim yesterday.

At a meeting at the party office in the city, Selim criticised foreign interference in country's internal political issues and said people will accept no formulas like unilateral election, declaration of emergency, third party, national government or prolonged caretaker government.

"We have to establish our rights through our mass movement," he added.

Presided over by Dhaka City Committee President Abdul Kader, the meeting was also addressed by Ruhin Hossain Prince, Mahbub Alam, Ahsan Habib Lablu and Dilip Bepari.

Condemning the mass arrest, baton charge and obstructing the movement of people, the speakers said no undemocratic force could ever stay in power by choosing the path of repression.

They called for immediate stopping of mass arrest and release of those arrested.

The speakers also urged all to make success the party programmes including tomorrow's demonstration, demonstration with black flag on Saturday and protest march to 'reject the farcical election' from January 14 to 20 across the country.

## Stop using children in political programmes

### Demand rights activists

Human rights activists at a meeting yesterday called on all not to use children in any political programmes or violence.

Children are being lured into political programmes and violent activities, which is contrary to the spirit of the constitution and UN Charter for Children, they said at a meeting organised by Chittagong city unit of Bangladesh Society for the Enforcement of Human Rights (BSEHR).

The rights activists called for an end to such practices. Otherwise, they warned, the names of the persons and organisations involving children in such activities would be made public and steps would be taken to bring them to justice.

They also demanded an end to the arrest and torture of innocent children who are being used in political programmes.

The children are being punished but the persons responsible for involving them in violent activities remain untouched, they said.

They called on probation officers, human rights organisations, journalists, lawyers, justices and members of the civil society to come forward to stop such practices.

The rights activists also criticised some organisations involved in monitoring polls for their unacceptable behaviour during the observation

process and for not submitting any reports on their findings to the Election Commission.

At the meeting, The BSEHR decided that each unit of the organisation would form a cell for proper observation of the upcoming polls and prepare two reports on the pre- and post-election situation.

Chittagong city BSEHR President Advocate Zia Habib Ahsan presided over the meeting held at the court building office of the organisation. Adv Md Sharif Uddin, Adv Syed Anwar Hossain, Mohammad Yusuf, Adv Anwar Ali, Hasmat Ara, Safina Amin, Md Nasir Uddin, Adv AHM Jasim Uddin, Syed Junayedus Salam and Syed Md Harun attended the meeting.

## NU exams postponed

## Cancellation of polls schedule demanded

Rajshahi unit of Awami League-led grand alliance has demanded cancellation of polls schedule, correction of updated voter list, reconstitution of the Election Commission (EC) and resignation of the chief adviser (CA).

The demands were placed by alliance leaders at a protest rally at Saheb Bazar zero point while observing the countrywide blockade programme yesterday.

They said CA Iajuddin Ahmed is conspiring to hold an election as per a blue-print of BNP-Jamaat-led four-party coalition.

The alliance leaders asked Iajuddin to quit the post of CA immediately, and appoint a non-party person as CA.

They said people will not allow anybody to hold farcical election in the country.

"We will resist such election at the cost of our blood," said AL leader Liton.

The speakers said it is not possible to hold a free and fair election with a partisan chief adviser and a flawed voter list.

The rally was addressed by NAP leader Mustafizur Rahman Khan, JSD leaders Julfikar Mannan Jami and Abdullah Al Masud Shibby, AL leader Naosher Ali, LDP leader Afzal Al Iqbal, JP leader Durul Huda and Workers' Party Politburo Member Fazle Hossain Badsha.

City unit AL General Secretary AHM Khairuzzaman Liton was in the chair.

Earlier, a procession was brought out that paraded main streets in the city.
