Long-term schemes like ID card a job of elected govt: 4-party

Urging the interim government to hold the election at the 'earliest possible time', BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan yesterday said it is the elected government's responsibility to do the long-term things like preparation of voter ID cards.

"The chief adviser said about resolving a lot of problems but it is not possible without long term plans and actions. And so, we think it is the duty of an elected government to do such things to serve the interest of the people," he told a press briefing at Hawa Bhaban in the capital.

The BNP secretary general, however, said people expected a specific timeframe for holding the election as the only task of the caretaker government is to assist the Election Commission.

He urged the caretaker government to hold the election at the earliest possible time that he said might be three months.

14-party wants arrest of corrupt, godfathers

The Awami League (AL)-led 14-party alliance yesterday expressed the hope that the caretaker government (CG) headed by Dr Fakhruddin Ahmed will take measures to hold a free, fair and credible general election as early as possible by reconstituting the Election Commission (EC).

Giving the alliance's formal reaction to the chief adviser's (CA) first address to the nation Sunday night, the AL general secretary said the people hope that the new CG will hand over power to an elected government following a fair and

credible election. This will add a new dimension to democracy in the country, he added.

"Our expectation is that the caretaker government will not only reconstitute the Election Commission but also appoint honest and political influence-free officials at all levels, who will be involved in the electoral process. This is needed to do away with the election engineering of the previous coalition government," he said.

Jalil said it is a must to arrest corrupt people, criminals and their godfathers, illegal arms and black

Committee formed to revitalise ACC

The council of advisers to the caretaker government (CG) yesterday formed a seven-member committee to look into legal, administrative and institutional issues of the Anti-corruption Commission (ACC) to find its shortcomings that need to be mended to combat corruption.

The seven-member committee headed by Law Adviser Barrister Mainul Hosein will pinpoint the shortcomings to make the ACC fully functional, Press Secretary to the Chief Adviser (CA) Syed Fahim Mumtaz said at a news briefing at the CA's office last night.

Other members of the committee are the communication adviser, cabinet secretary, home and finance secretaries, ACC secretary, and the attorney general.



Sangu gas production depleting too early

The country's first off-shore gas field Sangu, also the costliest of all fields, is faced with a premature rapid depletion with its daily production already almost halved, competent sources said.

The gas field's British operator Cairn is however frantically trying to increase its production by drilling the 10th well at the site and repairing two of the existing nine wells. The new well is expected to be completed by March 30.

Drilling of this extra well located four kilometres off the existing Sangu field platform will add \$20 million to the recoverable cost of Sangu for Cairn. Sangu platform is located 35 km off the coast in the Bay of Bengal.

Cairn already claims to have invested a staggering \$ 555.95 million in the field till 2005. Now, \$20 million plus other expenses will add to this.

The field has one completely dry well. With four troubled wells and four operational ones, it now

produces 91 million cubic feet gas per day (mmcf/d). A few years back, this field was producing 160 mmcf/d.

By repairing two troubled wells, Cairn hopes to raise production up to 125 mmcf/d by the end of this month. But Petrobangla believes that it might go up to 110 mmcf/d best.

Cairn believes that drilling of the 10th well might increase the field's production back to 160 mmcf/d as this would tap a new

Twin blasts kill 88 in Baghdad carnage

Two more GIs slain

At least 88 people were killed and more than 160 wounded yesterday after two nearly simultaneous bombs struck a predominantly Shia commercial area in central Baghdad in the deadliest attack in two months, officials said.

The first blast occurred shortly after noon when a bomb left in a bag placed among the stalls of vendors peddling DVDs and secondhand clothes exploded in the Bab al-Sharq area between Tayaran and Tahrir squares.

It was followed almost immediately by a parked car bomb just feet away. A suicide bomber killed at least 63 people in the same area last month.

Deputy Health Minister Hakim al-Zamil said at least 88 people were killed and 160 were wounded.

The explosions left body parts strewn on the bloodstained pavement as black smoke rose into the sky. Iraqi police sealed off the area

EC RECONSTITUTION

Two more commissioners ready to resign if asked

Recently appointed 'controversial' election commissioners Modabbir Hossain Chowdhury and Saiful Alam are ready to resign from their posts if the president requests them.

Talking to reporters, both the commissioners said they are ready to resign for the sake of the country and for the sake of a free and fair election.

President Iajuddin Ahmed on November 27 appointed two new election commissioners, Modabbir

Hossain Chowdhury -- who had aspirations for contesting in the election with a four-party alliance ticket from Habiganj-2 (Ajmiriganj-Baniachang) constituency, and Saiful Alam -- who does not have much of an illustrious background.

Awami League (AL)-led 14-party coalition rejected the two appointments outright.

Meanwhile, acting Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Justice Mahfuzur Rahman yesterday said, "The Election Commission (EC) is not thinking

anything about its possible reconstitution."

Asked about what they think about possible reconstitution of the EC following the new chief adviser's address to the nation, the acting CEC said, "We are not thinking anything."

"We were chitchatting," the acting CEC replied at the doorstep while leaving office as the reporters asked him what they had discussed in the EC meeting that had taken place a little earlier.
