

UN convention on graft to be sent soon to CA for nod

UNB, Dhaka

A summary on UN convention against corruption will soon be sent for approval of Chief Adviser Fakhruddin Ahmed as Bangladesh decided to be a signatory to it.

Talking to reporters yesterday, Foreign Affairs Adviser Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury said Bangladesh's image will enhance to a great extent with the signing of the convention.

According to the UN, the convention adopted in 2003 has so far been signed by 140 countries but ratified only by 80 countries. It came into effect last year.

Withdraw discretionary power of taxmen

MCCI asks govt to cut duty on raw materials, intermediary products

Leaders of the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI) urged the interim government to withdraw discretionary powers of the tax authorities, cut import duties on raw materials and intermediary products, continuation of tax holiday, and withdrawal of tax concession to whitening of black money.

They also asked the government to take immediate measures for creating additional power generation capacity to meet the country's growing energy needs.

They made the pleas by placing a 13-point proposal to Chief Adviser (CA) to the Caretaker Government (CG) Dr Fakhruddin Ahmed, when a 15-member delegation from MCCI led by its President Latifur Rahman met him in his office yesterday.

Arrest looters, 'creators' of godfathers

Hasina urges CG

Awami League (AL) President Sheikh Hasina yesterday demanded the caretaker government arrest those who created godfathers of criminals, looted state property and smuggled wealth out of the country, and bring to trial each case of corruption in the last 25 years.

"We want to firmly ask the caretaker government to take account of the wealth of those who were in power in the last 25 years, not only the last five or 10 years. Let all cases of corruption be properly investigated and tried to bring the

Asean envoys praise CG move to hold fair polls

UNB, Dhaka

Envoy of the Asean countries here yesterday praised the caretaker government's efforts to establish a role model for the future government in Bangladesh.

They hope the stalled elections will be held as soon as possible.

"We're satisfied with the manner the caretaker government is promoting free, fair and credible elections, which will be acceptable to this country and the international community at large," Malaysian High Commission Abdul Malek bin Abdul Aziz told reporters after a

meeting with Foreign Affairs Adviser Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury.

Being a member of the Asean Regional Forum (ARF), Bangladesh and Asean have close relationship, he said, adding that they came to express Asean's solidarity with the government.

On a question about Asean investment in Bangladesh, the Malaysian envoy said issues of trade and investment were discussed during the meeting.

Thai Ambassador Suphat Chitrakroh, Vietnam Ambassador Ngo Van Hoa, High

Commissioner of Brunei Abd Rahman Abd Hamid, Myanmar Counsellor U Thin Han, Philippines' Consul Alfredo Borlongan and Singaporean Consul Manik Binwani also attended the meeting.

Briefing the reporters, the foreign affairs adviser said the Asean envoys are happy that stability is returning to Bangladesh, which will increase investment here from their countries.

He said the envoys expressed their desire to invest in hotel, real estate and infrastructure sectors.

The High Court (HC) yesterday rejected the writ petitions challenging the legality of the cases filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) against some current and former officials of the crisis-ridden Oriental Bank.

An HC bench comprising Justice Syed Mohammad Dastagir Hossain and Justice Mamanur Rahman also ordered the government and the police not to arrest or harass the bank's former managing director CM Koyes Sami, current Senior Vice-president Tarikul Islam Khan and Additional Managing director M Shafiuuddin until a charge sheet is submitted against them.
