

Hasina for poll at the earliest possible time

Awami League (AL) President Sheikh Hasina has said they want holding of the stalled parliamentary elections at the earliest possible time as the Election Commission (EC) has already been reconstituted.

"We demanded reconstitution of the Election Commission and since the commission has been reconstituted, we want election as soon as possible," Hasina was quoted by her Political Secretary Saber Hossain Chowdhury as telling Baroness Paola Uddin and Lord Ahmed, two members of the House of Lords at Sudha Sadan yesterday.

BDR, BSF trade gunshots on Satkhira border

Indian Border Security Force (BSF) and Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) traded gunfire on Madra and Charabari borders under Kalaroa upazila early yesterday.

BDR sources said the BSF troops of Daharkanda camp under Swarupnagar Police Station in 24 Parganas district fired five bullets targeting the Madra BDR camp at about 2:30am, forcing the Bangladesh border guards to retaliate by firing over 15 shots.

On Charabali border, the BSF personnel of Tarali camp under the same police station fired seven

Outlaws kill 2 in Meherpur

Outlaws slaughtered two people at Bholadanga village of Gangi upazila in Meherpur yesterday.

The dead were identified as Sajib Ali, 35, and Mashur Rahman alias Hasan, 32, from Haridah village of the same upazila.

Notun Lal Juddho, a new faction of Purbo Banglar Communist Party (PBCP-ML), telephoned Gangi police and local journalists to claim responsibility for the killings.

Dilip Biswas, introducing himself over the phone as a top leader of the faction, claimed that his party eliminated Sajib and Mashur for their 'anti-social' activities.

Gangi police recovered the bodies and sent them to Meherpur general hospital for autopsies.

\$7.7b needed for gas exploration in 18 yrs

States Petrobangla report placed before advisory council

UNB, Dhaka

The country will need to invest \$ 7.7 billion in the next 18 years up to 2025 for the exploration of natural gas to meet its growing demand in line with the seven per cent GDP growth.

This was revealed in an exclusive report presented recently in the meeting of the council of advisers, a highly placed source said.

The report said the country will

need 24 trillion cubic feet (tcf) of additional gas to meet the national demand in the next 18 years.

Petrobangla, the state-owned hydrocarbon corporation, prepared the report while the energy division presented it to the council of advisers, aiming to give a thorough idea about the country's present state of natural gas and mineral resources and their future prospects.

Referring to the recently prepared "Gas Sector Master Plan

2006", the report said the country may meet the growing demand up to 2015 with the existing reserves.

"After that, the country will require new reserves to meet the growing demand. To ensure the availability of gas to meet the future demand, the country has to intensify exploration activities by 2010," suggested the report.

Rajuk knocks down 600 structures

Rajdhani Unnayan Kartipakkha (Rajuk) yesterday demolished around 600 illegal structures on Rokeya Sarani in Mirpur area yesterday.

Two magistrates led the Rajuk drive that lasted over four hours. The eviction drive was halted at one point when brickbats hurled by business owners and locals damaged a Rajuk vehicle. Police arrested at least three people from the area. The drive ended successfully without further hostility after the army arrived at the scene.

Many illegal shop owners removed their belongings and demolished their shops themselves before the drive started.

During the drive, Rajuk also demolished top floor of a 13-storied building, Al-Helal Hospital,

Fire damages goods in Square factory

A devastating fire at Square Consumer Products Ltd at Shalgaria in Pabna town Friday night damaged a huge amount of goods and machinery.

Sources said the fire originated from an electric short circuit around 10:00pm and quickly spread across

Square's crisp and chanachur factory and surrounding buildings in the compound.

The fire gutted valuable machinery, raw materials and the goods worth Tk 40 crore, firefighters and company sources said.

Firefighters from Pabna Fire Station rushed to the spot but failed to control the blaze. Later, a joint effort of the firefighters of Pabna Fire Station, Ishwardi Fire Station, Bera Fire Station and five other fire engines managed to get the fire under control around midnight.
