

Tapan warns politically affiliated organisers

Sports adviser Tapan Chowdhury on Saturday urged all politically affiliated persons to step down from the posts of the different sports federations.

"Those who have gained the post of different federations due to political blessing should step down from their own accord to prevent embarrassment. They should understand that being elected is not the sole criteria to hold the post," he told at a seminar titled "Inactive Sports: Road to Success", organised by Bangladesh Sports Writers Association (BSWA), at the auditorium of NSC Tower.

It was also his first extensive meeting with the sports organisers and reporters since he took oath as an advisor of the Fakhruddin Ahmed-led caretaker government last month.

He made this comment when asked whether he will take necessary steps to reform different federations by removing politically affiliated people despite the fact that they are elected.

"Time has come for the real organisers to come forward to create a healthy atmosphere in the sports arena. We can make a new start under this current adminis-

tration. I need support from you people to revive the hopes," said the sportsboss.

Chowdhury also vowed that he would leave no stone unturned to bring the corrupt people in the sports arena to the book as part of his government's policy.

"No doubt corruption has been

rampant in the sports arena. We will definitely touch those people who made corruption in this sector, no matter how deep their root is. I can assure you we will bring the culprits to the book," he assured.

The most discussed issue in the seminar was the role of the National Sports Council (NSC).

"Without any doubt you just close the organisation because you cannot see such kind of organisation in any other country in the world. I have had the experience as a former sports secretary to see how this organisation acted against the real interest of sports. I also request you to cancel the NSC act immediately," said the former bureaucrat.

"What we need to is to provide as much power as possible to the Bangladesh Olympic Association (BOA). The BOA must however be an elected body voted for by the different federations and they will only coordinate with the federations themselves," he suggested.

Chowdhury however said that he was more interested in creating a law that can bar the sports minister to also be the chief of the NSC.

"Yes, there is a lot of criticism

Compton comes to Eng A party


Opener Nick Compton warmed up well with a magnificent unbeaten 152 as England A cruised on the first day of their practice match against BCB National Academy XI at BKSP yesterday.

Opting to bat first, the visitors amassed 327-4 in 91 overs when stumps were drawn.

23-year-old Compton, the grandson of legendary English cricketer Dennis Compton, remained unbeaten on 152 while wicket-keeper-batsman Matt Prior accompanied him with 82 not out. Both batsmen shared an unbroken stand of 162 runs for the fifth wicket.

England A started brightly with Compton and Will Jefferson hitting the straps early on. The lanky Jefferson struck nine boundaries and a six in his assertive 58 but fell to left-arm spinner Mosharraf Hossain with the score on 85.

Paceman Dollar Mahmud got rid of captain Michael Yardy for 16 during a bright period for the Academy side. Off-spinner

during the period between lunch and tea.

Prior, coming in at number six, played an aggressive knock of 82 from 106 balls. He struck 19 fours while Compton, who reached his century off 169 deliveries, hit 14 four hits across the rope and two sixes.

The side will be led by another omission from the national side for the World Cup as batsman Tushar Imran remains captain of the second string side which begins the first four-dayer on February 22.

This will be Mashud's first appearance for the second string side while chances are also being handed to opener Mehrab and all-rounder Sharif.

The players are requested to report to A Team Head Coach Shaun Williams at the Dhaka Sheraton Hotel on February 18 at 5pm.

Yuvraj takes India home

Yuvraj Singh smashed a blistering 95 not out to guide India to a series-clinching seven-wicket win over Sri Lanka in the fourth and final one-dayer here on Saturday.

He received valuable support from Sourav Ganguly (58 not out) as India surpassed Sri Lanka's total of 259-7 with six overs to spare to win the series 2-1. The opening match was abandoned due to rain.

The win gave India a crucial psychological edge going into next month's World Cup in the Caribbean as they will meet Sri Lanka in Group B. Others in the group are Bangladesh and Bermuda, with the top two sides advancing to the next round.

Yuvraj and Ganguly built on Robin Uthappa's quickfire 37-ball 52 to steer their team home with a record 145-run stand for the unfinished fourth wicket in match reduced to 47-overs-a-side due to a damp outfield.

India's previous best for the fourth wicket against Sri Lanka was 128 between Rahul Dravid and Gavaskar in 2005.

The Indian batsmen eventually bowed to Sri Lankan Chamara Silva, who slammed an impressive 107 not out for his maiden hundred in one-dayers, although Silva clinched the man-of-the-match prize.

1. The exclusion of Khaled Mashud from the World Cup team has raised questions by captains like Gazi Ashraf Hossain, Akram Khan, Roquibul Hasan. Others have also expressed their opinions against the decision to discard Mashud. TV channels have started to question the decision, and more interestingly, an SMS voting conducted by Channel-i showed that more than 70% voted against the decision of excluding Mashud. It appears that majority cricket followers in Bangladesh want Mashud in the team. Gazi Ashraf even mentioned in a TV interview that some sort of 'underground-work' might have been done to keep Mashud out of the team. But in my opinion the very first point we should consider whether we are looking for a 'batsman-wicketkeeper' instead of a 'wicketkeeper-batsman'. A team like Bangladesh definitely needs an extra batsman who can contribute with some valuable runs. From that point of view, I don't see anything wrong to take Mashud.
