

13 more girl students of Benapole High School fall sick

Thirteen girl students of Benapole High School fell sick in their classroom yesterday due to a "mysterious disease".

Sources said Shirin, Mukti, Mousumi, Reshma, Sumona, Jannatun Nesa, Mukti, Azmira, Sarmin, Munni, Mariya and Rima, students of class VI, suddenly fell unconscious when their class was in progress.

With them, a total of 47 girl students of the school fell unconscious in the last four days, the school authorities said.

Hearing the news, a medical team from Sharsha Health Complex rushed to the spot yesterday and gave them first aid.

When contacted, health officer Dr Abdul Hai said, "We've checked up the students, but could not diagnose what caused the problem."

## Rly land recovered from encroachers at Akhaura

Bangladesh Railway (BR) has recovered two acres of land from encroachers at Akhaura in the

Led by first class Magistrate and Divisional Estate Officer Delwar Hossain, a railway team demolished more than 50 structures including two two-storey buildings and a market on its land at the western side of Borobazar.

Upazila Nirbahi Officer of Akhaura Kamrul Alam was present during the drive.

The team demolished one Yasin market comprising 10 shops in it. Advocate Yasin illegally built the market on the railway land some 35 years back, said the magistrate.

They also demolished a two-storey building where a medicine shop of Sadhona Ushadhalay was established some 70 years back.

One Harun-ur Rashid Bhuiyan claimed that their family took the possession of the land from the

Moharaja of Agartala in 1936 and produced papers in favour of his claim.

But the magistrate and the UNO did not listen to him and demolished the building, he added.

Harun said he will go to court.

The team also demolished more than 40 other tin-roofed structures including two stationery shops, two fertiliser shops and two wholesale rice shops.

One Ali Azgar Kha claimed that he and his relatives are the actual owners of the land since Pakistan period and he, too, will go to court.

Meanwhile, the railway authorities evicted some 65 families who had been residing on the railway land since the liberation of the country.

One Zohra Khatun told this correspondent that a former employee of railway allowed them to live there in exchange for toll revenue.

They are now living under the open sky, she added.

## 7 pirates held at Araihaazar

The army yesterday arrested seven pirates and recovered firearms, ammunition and explosives from Kadmirchar village at Araihaazar Upazila in the district.

The pirates are Yunus, Liakat Ali, Rekmat Ali, Kamal, Ali Hossain, Swapan and Al Amin, while the recovered arms are two foreign revolver, one shotgun, four cocktails, six rounds of revolver bullets and huge amount of lethal arms. The arrestees were taken to Fatullah army camp.

The army sources said they encircled the remote village to catch the pirates who mainly used to commit robbery in the Meghna river and after five hours of raid they arrested the thugs.

Meanwhile, members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) yesterday arrested one Abul Kashem, 40, as he demanded Tk 15,000 from trader Abdul Kader at Shanir Akhra identifying himself as a Rab member.

Rab sources said Kashem of Dewri Chourpara of Sadar Upazila, Narayanganj, has been extorting money from the people in Dhaka-Narayanganj area for long.
