Yunus to receive
honorary Doctor
of Laws degree
Says vice-chancellor

Dhaka University (DU) Vice-chancellor (VC) Prof SMA Faiz put an end to recent "convocation speaker controversy" by saying that Nobel laureate Prof Muhammad Yunus will attend the 43rd convocation ceremony of DU to receive his honorary Doctor of Laws degree.

The 43rd convocation ceremony of DU is scheduled to be held on February 28.

"He will certainly deliver a speech on the occasion of receiving his Doctor of Laws degree, but that will not be a convocation speech," Prof Faiz told The Daily Star categorically denying that Yunus would be the convocation speaker.

The VC said DU authorities in a letter on February 15 invited him to receive the honorary degree and to be the convocation speaker. Reading out Yunus's reply letter to DU authorities invitation, the VC said he gave consent to receiving the Doctor of Laws degree but Yunus did not say whether he would be the convocation speaker.

"Earlier, Pakistan's Nobel laureate Prof Abdus Salam and former prime minister Sheikh Hasina also delivered speeches on the occasion of receiving their degrees. Prof Yunus's will deliver a speech like they did but it will not be as the convocation speaker," Prof Faiz said.

However, the VC did not disclose this to the Academic Council meeting held February 18 despite a number of teachers opposed Yunus on the campus as convocation speaker for his present position. Even the VC remained silent in this regard until yesterday afternoon.

Asked why it was not disclosed earlier, the VC said, "There were only five teachers at the council meeting who opposed Yunus as convocation speaker and their protest was not strong, so I did not feel it was worth disclosing this earlier. But newspapers ran biased news items on this."

Yunus's possibility of becoming the convocation speaker sparked protest from a large section of DU teachers and different student organisations. They said a politician was never invited to the convocation as convocation speaker and Yunus became a politician by announcing his political party.

At a press conference yesterday, pro-Awami League Blue Panel teachers demanded that Yunus not be made convocation speaker.

Former Dhaka University Teachers' Association (Duta) president Prof AAMS Arefin Siddique said if the convocation was held on its previous schedule of December 24, teachers would allow Yunus there as convocation speaker since he had no political leanings then. But by announcing a political party, he has become a politician, the professor added.

At the press conference Prof Nazma Shaheen said the Nobel laureate has formed a political party and the formation of a political party means Yunus has a political opponent. So, he is a controversial person now, she added.

If a party chief attends the convocation as convocation speaker then the long tradition and sanctity of the DU convocation would be tarnished, as no politically affiliated person has been made convocation speaker in the 86 years of history of the university, Shaheen said.

President Iajuddin Ahmed yesterday asked the universities to take the key role for developing human resources in the country to face the challenges of globalisation.

"The country now needs more efficient human resources to face the challenge and the universities will have to take the key role to develop the human resources," he told the seventh convocation ceremony of American International University of Bangladesh (AIUB) at Bangladesh-China Friendship Convention Centre.

Iajuddin, also chancellor of the university, said the highest learning centres of the country must ensure "quality education" appointing competent teachers.

"What the universities need most is competent teachers who should be appointed through appropriate selection committee under a proper screening process," he said.

The president urged the University Grants Commission (UGC) to strictly monitor the issue of teachers' appointment.

He also urged the private universities to find ways to overcome their constraints regarding their own campuses, libraries, research facilities and congenial atmosphere.

The president reminded the graduates of their social responsibilities and duties towards the country.

AIUB Vice Chancellor Dr Carmen Z Lamagna chaired the ceremony.

Former chief adviser to a caretaker government Justice Latifur Rahman, UGC Chairman Prof Dr Asaduzzaman and AIUB Trustee Board Chairman Dr Anwarul Abedin also spoke at the function.

'Declare time frame to hold free, fair election'

Speakers at a discussion yesterday urged the caretaker government (CG) to declare a time frame for holding a free and fair election in the country.

They said a non-elected government should not stay in a democratic country like Bangladesh for an indefinite period.

The discussion on 'Our expectation from the caretaker government and political parties' was organised by Ekattorer Ghatok Dalal Nirmul Committee, a forum for secular Bangladesh, at the CIRDAP Auditorium.

National Professor Kabir Chowdhury, president of the Nirmul Committee, said it is possible for CG to hold next general election within six months.

"The CG should also take action against the syndicate to control the price spiral of essentials," said Kabir Chowdhury who presided over the discussion.

Air Vice Marshal (Retd) AK Khandaker Bir Uttam said a vast number of Jamaat leaders are engaged in corruption but the CG is yet to take any measures against them.

"People do not believe that Jamaat leaders were not involved in corruption

In Tarash upazila, they recovered 63 CI sheets from the house of union parishad member Shatullah in Shakoa Dighi village, and 27 other sheets from the house of BNP leader Reaz Uddin in Gurma village.

In Netrakona, the forces recovered 149 CI sheets for relief from Madan, Kendua and Mohonganj upazilas on Saturday night.

Of the sheets, 26 were recovered from Ratnapur village house of former general secretary of Madan poura BNP Haresur Rahman and 16 from Madan municipality Commissioner Abdus Salam's house on College Road.

Fifty CI sheets were recovered from Kendua upazila BNP leader Mir Kasim's house at Maska village while 57 others from Mohonganj upazila BNP leader Maniruddin's house at Magan village.

In Khagrachhari, the forces arrested Dighinala Upazila Jubo Dal GS Mohammad Abdur Rahman yesterday from Merung area for misappropriating government fund and land grabbing. He was sent to Khagrachhari jail.

In Gazipur, the joint forces recovered two bundles of CI sheets from the house of Kaliganj upazila Jubo Dal leader Mohammad Shahidullah.

Although he was awarded 14 years' imprisonment for the killing of Awami League leader Moyezuddin in 1984, former president HM Ershad pardoned him, and he later joined the BNP.

The forces also recovered two pistols with two bullets from listed criminal Abdul Hye's house at Kaliganj in Gazipur.

In Manikganj, police recovered 32 CI sheets used in the BNP office at Galabazar.

They also seized 16 CI sheets from the houses of Ansar Ali and Abdul Munnaf of Brahmanbaria village.

In Pabna, police recovered 34 CI sheets that were dumped in a pond of Mokam Ali in Batipara village in Chاتمohor upazila on Saturday night.

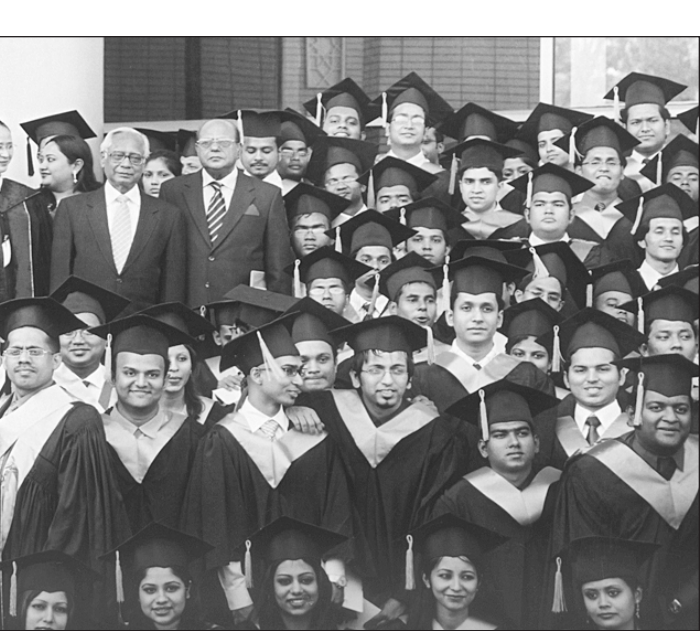
In Chandpur, joint forces recovered 18 CI sheets from the house of alleged criminal Boro Jamailya, who is known to be a cadre of a BNP leader and former state minister, at Meghdair village on Saturday night.

The forces arrested Mymensingh Chamber of Commerce President AKM Shamsuddin, who is widely blamed for patronising criminals, extortionists and land grabbers, from his Shyamoli residence in Dhaka City, reports UNB.

In Kushtia, the joint forces arrested Khoksha upazila AL President Sadaruddin Khan and recovered a .22 bore rifle and five bullets from his house at Samaspur village in the upazila early Sunday, reports UNB.

He was wanted in 12 cases including one for murder.

In Comilla, Rapid Action Battalion yesterday recovered a Chinese .22 bore revolver, two shot guns, one LG, eight knives and nine

Contractors capitalise on power crisis in talks

The government is also accepting the same deviation for the 50 MW Fenchuganj power plant to be installed by Ornate Services Ltd, which is owned by a close relative of a very powerful minister of the past alliance government.

A barge-mount plant is movable, while an immobile land-based plant demands land allocation and land lease agreement (LLA). This means the small power plant is going to block precious power plant site and prevent installation of bigger projects.

"The fact is Bangladesh does not have many land sites along with appropriate infrastructure where one can install power plants. It is utterly foolish to allow installation of some 50 MW plants on rental terms when we need to set up much bigger plants very soon," said an expert.

Hosaf is also being allowed to have a rental contract for five years instead of three years, keeping the power tariff the same. Power Development Board (PDB) experts say a rental contract for five years should be able to give a lower price quote than that of a three-year contract. Hosaf is availing this undue benefit both in its Feni and Barabkundu power projects (20 MW each).

The authorities are also giving Hosaf and GBB huge additional time to commission Barabkundu and Bogra projects after signing of the GSA with them. Both have sought 60 days in addition to their original 90 days for project implementation.

Moreover, the United Group that is setting up an 80 MW plant in Shahjibazar sought 30 days' additional time after signing of the GSA. "This should have been enough to cancel their contracts," said a PDB official.

"But they gave the argument that implementation time for Feni and Kumargaon power projects was 150 days, and they should also be allowed the same," the official added.

The government therefore is now considering fixing the project implementation time to 150 days, giving them 60 days' additional time.

The PDB Board on February 19 held a meeting and discussed the deviations.

On the issue of allowing land-based plants instead of barge-mount ones, the board admitted that this was a deviation. "But it will take about a year if this is re-tendered. Considering the severe power crisis of present times, the

government may take a decision on this matter," the board said.

The government in December last aimed at completing all the agreements by the middle of last month to add 260 MW power by June-July this year. But this bid went slow due to problems related to low gas pressure at the power project sites.

Headed by Power Adviser Tapan Chowdhury, the power ministry on February 19 held a meeting and decided to ask Petrobangla to ensure appropriate high pressure gas supplies to the power projects.

"This 260 MW venture is nothing when you consider that the country is facing about 2,200 MW load shedding and there is no viable large power project in the pipeline. The alliance government did the blunder and this government should not just brood over some bad ideas like power rental," said an expert.

"It is time the government scrap these half-baked and largely politically favoured deals and move on to real power projects," he added. "We have implemented large projects ahead of time in the late nineties and it is possible to do so if the policymakers have that kind of commitment."

Robbers kill Gazipur poultry farm owner

A group of Robbers slayed a poultry farm owner and looted Tk 80000 in cash, gold ornaments and other valuables from the residence of his father-in-law at Borteck village in Kapasia, Gazipur on Saturday night.

The victim, identified as Joinal Abedin, 37, was staying at his father-in-law Anwar Hossain's residence during the robbery. Police arrested a suspect of the robbery, identified as Delwar Hossain, 26, yesterday morning.

Sources said armed robbers entered a poultry farm owned by Abedin at about 1:30am, woke up Khokon, an employee of the farm and forced him to go to the residence of Anwar Hossain.

They made Khokon wake Abedin up and once Abedin opened the door, the robbers tied him with rope and slayed in a room at the corner.

Later they made his mother-in-law hand them the key of the almira's and looted cash, gold ornaments and other valuables before leaving the spot.

During the robbery, Abedin's wife and two children were staying at his rented house at Uttara while his father-in-law Anwar Hossain was staying at his village at Sonmania in Kapasia with his second wife.

Indian killed in road crash

An Indian citizen was killed and four others were injured in a road accident at Rajapur on Pabna-Rajshahi Highway yesterday.

The dead was identified as Milin Baidday, 46, of Mumbai in India. He was leading an Indian consultant team, sources said.

The accident took place at about 12:00 noon when Milin Baidday along with his team was going to Pabna in a jeep to visit 'Square Pharmaceuticals. The jeep plunged into a roadside ditch as its front wheel was punctured at Rajapur, leaving Milin Baidday dead on the spot and four others injured.

Of the injured, Prokash Shindey, Bijoy and Rajen Karen of India and jeep driver Sumon were rushed to Pabna General Hospital.

CU Correspondent adds: A tempo driver was killed in a road accident at City Gate area under Pahartali Police Station in Chittagong yesterday.

The dead was identified as Mohammed Sirazul Islam, 55, son of late Golam Sharif, of the City Gate area.

The accident occurred at around 7.00am when a speeding truck knocked a tempo. Sirazul was rushed to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) where he succumbed to his injuries at around 8.00am, sources said.

owner Nazim Habibuzzaman mentioned that the accused in collusion with others misappropriated Tk 36 crore from the public fund during 2002-04 and Mosharraf had assisted them in doing the crime while he was in charge of the health ministry.

Nazim in his complaint said Mosharraf illegally sanctioned Tk 6 crore to the BMA, which was embezzled. The BMA took Tk 30 crore from the government through unfair means in connivance with Mosharraf for the construction of a building on an illegally occupied land.

Nazim, also the president of Bangladesh Gonotrantrik Dal, claimed that he legally owns the land on which the BMA Bhaban was constructed.

Meanwhile, a Dhaka court yesterday sent the graft case filed earlier against Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) chairman and one of its engineers to the Anti-corruption Commission (ACC) for investigation.

On February 13, BMA Bhaban's landowner Nazim Habibuzzaman filed the case with the Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court against Rajuk Chairman KM Harun Ur Rashid and Engineer Mohammad Muzaffar Uddin for taking Tk 1 crore as bribe from land grabbers.

After scrutinising relevant documents, Judge Mohamamd Momin Ullah of the Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court passed the order for the ACC investigation.

In his complaint in the case filed on February 13, Habibuzzaman mentioned that a group of miscreants illegally took possession of 66 decimals of land at 15/2 Topkhana Road in 1979 while the complainant along with his family members was abroad. The miscreants built a building on the land without any approval from Rajuk and hung a signboard of BMA there.

Following the incident, Rajuk sent a letter to the intruders asking them to show the blueprint of the building. But Rajuk did not take any step for demolishing the BMA Bhaban even though the grabbers failed to show the blueprint, the complainant added.

Rajuk, on February 1 this year, decided to conduct a drive to demolish the BMA Bhaban following a letter from the complainant urging them to do so. On February 7, Rajuk conducted a drive demolishing illegal structures from Shapla Chatter in Motijheel to National Press Club in Paltan. However, the Rajuk team left the BMA Bhaban untouched as the chairman and the engineer of Rajuk took Tk 1 crore as bribe from the intruders, Habibuzzaman alleged.

PILFERING TRANSPORT FUEL

2 CCC staffs, pump owner held

Joint forces yesterday unearthed a syndicate at Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) that was involved in pilfering transport fuel and arrested two CCC officials, two drivers and one refuelling station owner in this connection.

The arrestees were identified as CCC Superintendent Engineer (mechanical) Abul Hasnat, Transport Pool Officer Joysen Barua, CCC drivers Abdur Razzak, Shah Alam and owner of Sagarika Petrol Pump Jalal Ahmed.

A team of the joint forces arrested Razzak and Alam from their houses and Jalal from his petrol pump at Olonkar Intersection area in the early hours of yesterday. On their confessions, the team later arrested Hasnat and Joysen from CCC office at around 3:00pm and took all of them to the army camp at Sagarika Road in Halishahar.

The two drivers confessed that they have long been pilfering fuel being allocated for CCC transports in connivance with the two officials and the petrol pump owner.

"We were forced to pay Tk 300 each to the two officials against

each vehicle of the CCC to get allocation of 80 litre fuel every day," revealed Alam and Razzak.

They said, "Generally we used to use around 20 to 30 litre of the allocated 80 litre fuel against each vehicle and the remaining fuel was sold to the petrol pump owner."

Through this system, a huge quantity of fuel has been pilfered everyday from the CCC, they admitted.

Of the around 550 vehicles of the CCC, around 175 still run on fuel while the rest were converted as CNG-run transports, sources said.

The two CCC officials however denied the allegations, they said.

The joint forces in the afternoon summoned CCC Chief Engineer Mokhtar Ahmad to their camp at Sagarika Road and detained him in connection with the fuel pilferage from the CCC Transport Pool.

The joint forces were interrogating all the six till writing of this report in the evening.

CCC Chief Engp released

Our staff correspondent adds at night: Detained CCC Chief Engineer Mokhtar Ahmad was released in the evening on the ground to allow him attend a minis-

terial meeting to be held in Dhaka today.

Sources said the chief engineer was however asked to report to the joint forces immediately after returning from Dhaka.

BSF kills one

Indian Border Security Force (BSF) shot dead a Bangladeshi national on Darshana boked of Damurhuda upazila in Chuadanga on Saturday night.

The dead was identified as Jan Mohammad, 30, a farmer from Joynagar village in the same upazila. Quoting family members, Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) said at around 10:00pm, BSF fired on Jan Mohammad when he went near pillar 76-77 to look for his missing cattle.

BSF then took the body into Indian territory, BDR said. Tension mounted in the area when BSF continued firing towards the Bangladesh territory and BDR returned fire. Exchange of fire continued till 4:30am during which around 100 shots were fired.

CG firm to eradicate corruption, hoarding

CA tells FNB team

sion, a number of problems faced by the NGOs in the implementation of their various programmes were brought to the notice of the CA.

Allegation of corruption in case of disbursement of funds and selection of project partners were also raised by the delegation.

The CA assured the FNB delegates of looking into the issues raised by them with a view to ensuring unhindered implementation of their programmes.

CAMPE Director Rasheda K Chowdhury, RDRS Executive Director Kamaluddin Akbar, BURO Executive Director Zakir Hossain and BELA Director Syeda Rizwana Hasan were present on the occasion.
