

Appointment of Ruhul Amin as new CJ hailed

UNB, Dhaka

The Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) yesterday hailed the appointment of Justice M Ruhul Amin as new Chief Justice of Bangladesh, with the hope for a better day.

Justice Amin succeeds Chief Justice Syed J R Mudassir Husain who retires on February 28 after presiding over the highest judiciary in a trying time punctuated with incidents of turbulence.

The President gave the appointment of the new Chief Justice on Sunday with effect from March 1.

SCBA President Barrister M Amir-Ul Islam welcomed the new Chief Justice and said, "The appointment has been made following the conventions."

He hoped that image of the judiciary would be "redeemed" under the stewardship of Justice Amin, who had earlier been superseded twice.

Barrister Amin also expected that the relations between the bench and the bar would improve through upholding the constitution and the rule of law.

Senior lawyers of the bar observed that the appointment of Justice Amin as Chief Justice seemed to bring an end to "culture of superseding".

Dismissal of 34 RDA staffs challenged

A Rajshahi court yesterday issued a show cause notice asking the Rajshahi Development Authority (RDA) to explain why the dismissal of its 34 employees would not be declared unlawful.

Tapan Chandra Majumder and Chief Executive Officer Akhtaruzzaman to reply within five days.

The order came after the 34 employees filed a case alleging that the RDA dismissed them in violation of rules and with an ulterior motive.
