Lease, sale of govt land without tender declared illegal

UNB, Dhaka

The High Court (HC) yesterday declared unlawful any lease, sale or transfer of government land to any person merely on applications without following a transparent process like tender or auction.

The court asked the government to follow the order and convey it to all the ministries.

Disposing of a writ petition, a division bench comprising Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain and Justice Quamrul Islam Siddiqui passed the order.

Lawyers termed it a landmark judgment as many government lands were leased out or handed over to the vested interest groups and individuals in obscure processes.

In its order, the court said since the government lands are being leased out or transferred to individuals on mere applications and the

## Formalin fish back in city markets

The supply of fish from Myanmar to the wholesale markets in the capital has returned to almost "normal" just five days after the biggest ever drive against formalin-laden fish at three large fish markets.

It was learnt at the Sawarighat wholesale market yesterday that the supply of Burmese fish remained suspended for two days after Saturday's drive that saw seizure and destruction of 6.5 tonne fish.

Meanwhile, retailers' disinterest in buying Burmese fish has resulted in a 50-percent increase in the prices of local fish, especially ruhi and katha.

The presence of Burmese fish at the wholesale markets, however,

Ex-BNP MP Salahuddin's super-costly car found parked at Morshed Khan's business office

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) yesterday seized a luxury sport utility vehicle (SUV) owned by Harris Chowdhury, former political secretary to immediate past prime minister Khaleda Zia, and arrested his two brothers-in-law along with the driver of the car.

Earlier on Sunday, joint forces seized an ultra luxury Range Rover imported by former state minister for communications Salahuddin Ahmed from Pacific Centre at Mohakhali in the city -- former foreign minister Morshed

was not as much as before, and a few traders said it is because of the business men's cautiousness.

"Traders do not display Burmese fish openly in the market; they keep very few samples mixed with local ruhi and katha. They only sell it to retailers they know well," said a shrimp trader.

Another trader said they are facing difficulties in selling Burmese fish since most retailers are not willing to take any risk by buying them.

"As far as we know, importers have sent their imported fish to different cold storages and are waiting for the situation to become normal," said a businessman, adding, "We used to get supply of around 8,000-10,000kg fish everyday, which has now halved."

On Saturday, a mobile court

comprising the joint forces destroyed around 6.5 tonne formalin-treated fish and seized around 187kg jatka (small Hilsha) from the wholesale fish markets at Sawarighat, Kaptan Bazar and Waizgat in the city. Lion part of the fish was imported from Myanmar.

None of the law enforcement authorities deployed any forces at the wholesale markets following the drive to check entrance of Burmese fish.

A senior army officer told The Daily Star that they are corresponding with the government departments concerned to stop import of fish as it is not possible to raid or deploy forces at every market.

Many wholesale fish traders claimed that they do not use formalin in fish and that the fish is

## BARAPUKURIA Power plant chokes with imported coal

The country's lone coal-based power plant at Barapukuria is now facing difficulties in generating electricity due to use of imported coal with high sulphur content and excessive clay and sand, plant sources said.

The 250 MW plant was facing a crisis of coal as Barapukuria Coal Mine Company Ltd (BCML) repeatedly failed to resume production at the coal mine and supply coal to the power plant since October last year.

One of the two units of the plant remained out of operation for long due to coal shortage, and production in both the units started on February 25 using coal imported by the Power Development Board (PDB) from a neighbouring country.

The BCML had suspended

production at the coal mine in October for phase development and to shift equipment to another site. But the long delay in doing that forced the power plant to opt for imported coal, PDB officials in Dinajpur said.

BCML sources however said although coal production was suspended in June last, partial production continues since then.

As production at the coal mine did not resume in time, mine officials had verbally informed the power plant authorities about this, and urged them to arrange alternative coal supply. The PDB then went for coal import to maintain smooth power generation during the current IRRI-Boro season.

Meanwhile, China Machinery Company (CMC) that built the power plant has informed the PDB

## Crack develops in burned building

ntv chief dismisses rumour of sabotage

A crack was found yesterday on the ninth floor of Bangladesh Steel and Engineering Corporation (BSEC) Bhaban after a devastating blaze burned the 11-storey building two days ago at the teeming Karwan Bazar in the capital.

Although two government bodies probing the fire incident could not ascertain any reason for the fire, Enayetur Rahim, managing director (MD) of ntv, located on the sixth floor, dismissed the rumour of sabotage. The ntv and Rtv will move to another building to resume operations, he added.

Staffers of the ninth floor noticed the crack in the floor at the

## 500 more CI sheets of relief seized

The joint forces arrested two local leaders of BNP and its youth wing Jatiyatabadi Jibto Dal for possessing corrugated iron (CI) sheets meant for relief in Netrakona and Lalmonirhat and recovered 497 such sheets from across the country.

Police and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested 1,663 others who include 42 convicted in different criminal cases, 976 wanted criminals and 19 others accused in arms and explosives acts in 24 hours ending at 6:00am yesterday, said a home ministry press release.

Members of the armed forces recovered 52 people including 35 criminals during the period.

## Fake \$8 crore in 100-dollar notes seized in city

The Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) recovered some 8,00,000 fake 100-dollar notes along with dollar-minting materials at SA Paribahan counter in the capital's Mohakhali area last night.

Of the sheets, 83 were seized from the house of BNP leader Azizul Haque of Balali village in Madanupazila and arrested him.

The forces also seized 22 CI sheets from BNP leader Abdullah Master's house in the same village and another eight pieces from BNP leader Motahar Hossain's house at Shaldiga village in Purbadhal.

In Narayanganj, security forces recovered 39 CI sheets of government relief and 18 poles abandoned by local BNP leader and Dhupara Union Parishad Chairman Ruhul Amin.

## Chief justice retires with controversy at heels

With a number of controversies surrounding him, Chief Justice Syed JR Mudassir Husain retired yesterday without receiving a traditional farewell from the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA).

A group of pro-BNP and pro-Jamaat-e-Islami lawyers, government law officers including the attorney general, and the High Court (HC) and Supreme Court (SC) judges, however, accorded a farewell to Mudassir.

Five HC judges did not attend the farewell function held at the Chief Justice's Courtroom yesterday morning.

This was for the second time that the SCBA refrained from according farewell to a retiring chief justice. Earlier in 1989, the

highest ranking association of the country's lawyers refrained from giving farewell to the then chief justice AFM Munim.

SCBA President barrister Amirul Islam said, "When we discussed among ourselves the issue of giving [Mudassir Husain] the farewell, senior lawyers said they did not find any reason to laud him at the farewell function. So, why give him a farewell?"

Barrister Amir rather levelled charges against the outgoing chief justice, saying, "In the last five years, the chief justice did not even attempt to stop the alliance government's bid to politicise the judiciary. Instead, he did whatever the government had asked him to do."

Citing different instances of controversial actions, Amir said, "The Supreme Court has given the

country important guidelines whenever the country faced a crisis. When there was such a crisis in the country and people resorted to the court for guidelines during Mudassir's tenure, he posed as a hurdle against justice."

Amir alleged that there are several instances where the chief justice dissolved certain benches that had given verdicts on sensitive cases and even curtailed the powers of some benches that dealt with similar sensitive cases.

"He did not let the judges work independently. He also hampered the judges' rights in conducting judicial works--this is a violation of the constitution," said Amirul Islam, one of the most senior and eminent lawyers of the country.

He welcomed new Chief Justice Mohammad Ruhul Amin, saying, "The Supreme Court has given the

## ACC list of 15 graft suspects sent to govt

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) yesterday sent a list of 15 graft suspects to the Cabinet Division and home ministry to initiate the process of confiscating their properties.

They failed to submit wealth statements to the ACC in time.

"As per the emergency power rules, the government will seek permission from magistrates to freeze properties of corruption suspects who have failed to submit wealth statements. The government

will now specify the authorities which will initiate this process," ACC Secretary Delwar Hossain told The Daily Star.

The 15 are on the list of 50 graft suspects whom the ACC had asked to submit wealth statements within 72 hours that ended on Sunday.

They include Tarique Rahman's business partner Giasuddin Al Mamun, former prime minister Khaleda Zia's political secretary Harris Chowdhury, Awami League (AL) leader Mohiuddin Ahmed, Bashundhara Group chairman Ahmed Akbar Sobhan (Shah Alam) and former National Board of Revenue (NBR) member Jahurul Haque.

Of the 15, seven AL leaders have

## 3 Rajuk staff arrested for cheque forgery

A Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) team yesterday arrested three Rajdhani Unnayan Kartirikapakha (Rajuk) officials for their alleged involvement in cheque forgery.

Rab sources said the arrestees--Rajuk Director (finance and accounts) Md Humayun Khan, Deputy Director (finance and accounts) and Md Hasan, an officer of the administration section--drew Tk 16,43,035 against Tk 87,035 forging 19 cheques in 2005.

According to Rab sources, 14 out of the 19 cheques were found fake.

Rajuk Secretary Ataul Haque Molla filed a case in this connection with Motijheel Police Station in 2005.

## Khaleda's house under watch for Tarique aides

Security personnel yesterday stepped up surveillance around former prime minister and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's residence on Moinul Hossein Road in Dhaka Cantonment.

A reliable source yesterday told The Daily Star that the measure was taken after intelligence agencies were informed that Hawa Bhaban spokesman Ashik and Tarique Rahman's close aides Mia Nurul Apu and Shakil had been

hiding inside Khaleda's house.

Four security personnel were seen standing at the entrance of the house at about 5:30pm yesterday.

Ashik, Apu and Shakil might have taken shelter in the house to evade arrest during the ongoing drive by the joint forces, said the source.

The three are known for their controversial activities during the last five years of the BNP-led alliance government's rule.

It is alleged that Khaleda's eldest son Tarique Rahman is one of the beneficiaries of the activities of these three.

## Yunus tells of new goals for students

Receives honorary degree at DU convocation

Nobel Peace Prize winner Prof Muhammad Yunus yesterday urged Dhaka University students to be more original in their thought and be more innovative in finding ways to take advanced technology to the poor.

The Nobel laureate also called for a separate stock exchange for businesses for the good of the people that would cater to investors willing to buy shares of locally designed

innovative organisations run by students to eradicate poverty.

Yunus made these comments while speaking at Dhaka University's 43rd convocation after receiving an honorary Doctorate of Law from the university for winning the Nobel Peace Prize along with his brainchild Grameen Bank.

"I think the new spaces of knowledge can only be created by protecting the students' individuality. If students completely mould
