

Set up deep sea port in Ctg to boost economy

Economists tell Ctg Forum discussion

Economists and civil society members at a discussion yesterday demanded that the government pay special attention for development of Chittagong, especially its port and set up a deep sea port, saying this will boost the economy and check smuggling significantly.

They also demanded establishment of a mega airport, development of communications infrastructure and administrative decentralisation to facilitate the export-import of the neighbouring landlocked countries.

But unfortunately, lack of legal business facilities, including ports and infrastructure, between the neighbouring countries increased smuggling, which also contributed to the criminalisation of politics in the country, they said.

Chittagong Development Forum-Dhaka organised the discussion on 'Development of Chittagong is supplementary to national development' at the National Press Club in the city. Fortune Shopping Mall, Dhaka and Roots Doors and Furniture, Chittagong sponsored it.

"We strongly demand opening up the Chittagong port and setting up a deep sea port. We are not against the privatisation of ports, but that must be through transparent process and the state must not lose its ownership," said Professor Dr Moinul Islam of Chittagong University.

"But unfortunately, we are not using the golden goose (Chittagong Port)," he said, adding that Chittagong is located in such a strategic location that it can be more developed than that of Singapore.

presentation said large ships with more load capacity are used in the globalised world, and "If our port fails to cope up with these large ships in loading and unloading, ship owners will divert their attention to other ports."

"If such things happen due to our incapacity, it will be like disasters for our employment, export-import business and earning foreign exchange," he said emphasising the establishment of a deep sea port and modernising the Chittagong Port.

Muhammad Ibrahim also suggested establishing Chittagong and Kunming of China as twin-cities for strengthening the business relations with China.

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) yesterday detained mistakenly the Janakantha Editor Atiqullah Khan Masud from Bangla Motor in the capital and released him after a while.

The incident occurred when the editor of the Bangla daily was coming to his office at New Eskaton from the Dhaka Cantonment area at about 10:45am.

A Rab patrol team suspected the number-plate of his car and followed him up to Bangla Motor where they challenged him.

Rab spokesman Commander Masuk told the news agency that the Janakantha editor was 'mistakenly' held. He was dropped at his Janakantha office with due honour after it was confirmed that it was a mistake.

Valuables worth Tk 1 crore gutted

Cotton, yarn and machinery worth of Tk about one crore were gutted by fire in Shohagpur Textile Mill at Lakhon Khola under Bandar upazila in the early hours of yesterday.

Mohammad Alam, 45, a security officer of the mill, was injured while fighting to extinguish the fire and was admitted to Khanpur hospital for treatment.

According to Bandar fire service sources, the fire originated from the finishing section of the mill due to the friction of machinery at 3:00am.

The fire spread in the adjacent godown and damaged dyes and chemicals, stockpiled row cotton, yarn and machinery.

The fire service rushed to the spot at 3:30am and brought the fire under control after three hours at 5:30am.

A three-member inquiry committee was formed to inquire the causes of the fire.

Form election caretaking council to assist EC

Speakers say at BMSP seminar

Bangladesh Manobadhikar Samannaya Parishad (BMSP) yesterday proposed to form an Election Caretaking Council (ECC) which will assist the Election Commission (EC) in carrying out its election-related activities as a supporting force.

The proposal was made at a seminar titled 'Election Caretaking Council for a free, fair and meaningful election' organised by BMSP at WVA auditorium in the city.

Speakers at the seminar said the ECC could be formed comprising the members of civil society, political parties, professional bodies and people's representatives.

Since the EC does not have any supporting organisation, the ECC will perform the supporting works from the time of processing the nomination papers till the announcing of the election results, they said.

In a keynote paper, BMSP President AHM Noman said it is the appropriate time to form the ECC as discussion about the electoral reforms

has been going on now.

The tenure of the EEC will be of total 12 months including nine months before the election and three months after the election, he added.

M Hafizuddin Khan, former adviser to caretaker government, said the Representation of the People Order (RPO), 1972 which is the primary law for holding the election, is not observed properly.

He also expressed concern over the corruption and nepotism in the Public Service Commission (PSC) which will affect the whole country for long after five to six years.

Laying emphasis on holding the election within the quickest possible time, Hafizuddin said the corrupt elements must be punished and the 'cleansing operation' should be completed before holding the polls.

Members of BMSP executive committee Babul Kumar Adhikary, AKM Abul Kashem, Nilufar Quadery and Binoy Krishna Mallik also spoke on the occasion.

Govt plans 5-yr Hajj policy

The government is formulating a five-year Hajj policy this time instead of yearly basis, Adviser for Religious Affairs Major General (Retd) Dr ASM Matiur Rahman said yesterday.

Speaking at a roundtable organised here to find ways for ensuring proper and well-controlled Hajj management, Matiur questioned the justification for formulating the Hajj policy every year.

He said corruption and deception are not desirable in the significant affair like Hajj management.

Matiur underscored the need for removing various problems in the Hajj management. He said the government would make all-out efforts to arrange permanent accommodation in Saudi Arabia for Bangladeshi Hajj pilgrims.

The adviser stressed the need for recommendations from all concerned, including HAB (Hajj Association of Bangladesh), in formulating the Hajj policy.

Presided over by Religious Affairs Secretary Ataur Rahman, the roundtable was also addressed by former secretary Abdullah Haroon Pasha, former religious affairs secretaries Saifuddin and Rafiqul Islam, Secretary of the Jatiya Sangsad Secretariat ATM Ataur Rahman, Director General of Islamic Foundation Fazlur Rahman, Prof Hasan Abdul Quyyum and HAB President Omar Faruk.

Supreme Court Ainjibi Samity polls Mar 28-29
