

Hasina hopes for free, fair polls soon

Awami League (AL) President Sheikh Hasina yesterday said she hopes that a free and fair election will be held soon to restore democratic and constitutional process.

"I hope a democratic process will return as early as possible. Free and fair polls will be held and the country will run following the constitutional dictates. Inshallah, darkness will fade away ushering in light," observed the AL chief.

She was speaking at a gathering of Bangladesh Mohila Awami League at the city's Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh. Dr Shirin Sharmin Chowdhury presented the keynote speech at the discussion titled "Contribution of the Bangladeshi Women in the global context".

Hasina said a nation cannot thrive without democracy. She said the people have been with them all along in the efforts to steer the

73 expelled on first day of SSC exams

UNB, Dhaka

Seventy-three students were expelled for cheating in the English first paper examination yesterday, the first day of the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examinations.

Of them, 39 were expelled in Rajshahi, 14 in Chittagong, seven in Dhaka, five in Barisal, four in Comilla, three in Jessore and one was expelled in Sylhet.

As many as 10,29,885 students are appearing in the SSC, Dakhil and SSC Vocational examinations under nine education boards.

Two fake examinees found at Ramu and Moheshkhali centres under Chittagong Education Board were handed over to the police.

In Pabna, police arrested a student of Edward College who was taking the examination as proxy for a student of Asrafuddin High School in Algharia upazila.

Education Adviser Ayub Qadri yesterday visited six examination centres in the capital and Savar.

The High Court (HC) yesterday stayed for a month the National Board of Revenue (NBR) directives to the banks concerned to furnish information about banking transactions by former law minister Moudud Ahmed, whose accounts have been frozen.

7 SMALL POWER PROJECTS

Purchase body scraps controversial bids

The advisory council committee on purchase yesterday cancelled controversial tenders for seven small power projects and asked the Power Development Board (PDB) to invite fresh tenders.

It also cancelled a tender for filling up 22 land allotments under Rajuk's third phase Uttara residential area development. Excessive rate quoted for the job was the reason for cancellation of the tender.

The committee has asked the Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) to float fresh for the job. It however approved the work to fill up 25 other land allotments.

After a meeting of the committee yesterday, its Chairman and Finance Adviser Mirza Azizul Islam

told the press that the tenders for power schemes were cancelled because the contractors were deviating from the original terms.

"Though the jobs had already been awarded, the government did not sign any agreement with the contractors. If they want to change the terms and conditions for setting up the plants then we'll have to consider changing the rate for purchase of power," he observed.

"And that's why we have asked the PDB to go for fresh tenders," Islam noted.

Meeting sources said the tenders for small power schemes were cancelled because of 'serious irregularities' in the process that is being scrutinised also by the joint forces.

Taking advantage of the impending power crisis, the small power

contractors were grossly deviating from original tenders. Of the seven schemes that amount to 260 megawatts in capacity, three were awarded to the Hosaf group, and one each to Ornate, GBB, Summit and United groups.

Hosaf group, a favourite of the immediate past alliance government, was seeking a major change in terms for its 50-megawatt Nowapara (Sikalbaha) power plant. As per the original tender, it was supposed to set up a barge-mount plant there. But later it wanted to build a land-based power plant.

Ornate Services, owned by a close relative of an immediate past former minister, sought similar favour for its 50-megawatt Fenchuganj plant.

A barge-mount plant is movable

Indo-Bangla dialogue ends with call to foster cultural cooperation

A three-day Indo-Bangladesh dialogue that concluded yesterday recommended stronger cooperation in the field of media and culture to remove suspicions and mistrust between the two neighbouring nations.

It also suggested formation of a number of joint organisations consisting journalists and cultural activists in line with that of India-Bangladesh chambers of commerce and industry.

Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) Executive Director Debapriya Bhattacharya summed up the recommendations of the dialogue titled 'Indo-Bangladesh Dialogue on Media and Culture' organised by CPD in collaboration with India International Centre (IIC) at Brac

Centre Inn in the capital.

Joint media investigations can be carried out on border conflicts, water, migration and cross-border insurgency, Debapriya said, adding that eminent writers and scholars from both the countries can write columns on bilateral issues regularly in major newspapers of both the countries.

Newspapers and TV channels of the two countries can provide part-time job opportunities for young journalists to facilitate exchange of expertise and experience and have resident correspondents, he noted.

Journalists should write more about the visa restrictions that they often encounter, which can help them facilitate free flow of information and ensure their professional

Open market sale of essentials from March 18

In a bid to rein in the spiralling prices of essentials throughout the country, the government is launching open market sale (OMS) from March 18.

"We will sell one lakh metric ton rice and another one lakh metric ton wheat across the country through OMS," Finance Adviser Mirza Azizul Islam told the reporters yesterday after a meeting of the purchase committee at the Secretariat.

The adviser also said that the government has decided to withdraw existing five percent import duty on rice and wheat to scale down the prices and necessary order in this regard will be issued in a couple of days.

These steps would help to check

the skyrocketing price of the essentials, Azizul said.

Under this year's OMS programme, one person may get a maximum of five kilogram (kg) rice at Tk14.50 per kg.

Besides, the adviser also disclosed that the government is going to begin Food for Work programme from March 15. One lakh metric ton of wheat will be allocated for the programme and the purchase committee yesterday approved the proposal for import of the wheat, he added.

Asked about the management of Food for Work programme when many local government representatives like Union Parishad (UP)

Bangladesh restrict Scotland to 152-9

Bangladesh maintained their impressive run in the build up to the Cricket World Cup when they restricted Scotland to 152-9 in 50 overs on Thursday in the last warm-up match ahead of the cricket's showpiece event in the West Indies.

The Tigers, who won a triangular series involving Canada and group rivals Bermuda before stunning New Zealand by two wickets Tuesday, elected to field after winning the toss at the 3Ws Oval in Barbados.

ICC associate members Scotland, who visited Bangladesh

after earning their one-day status and lost the two-match series, lost the first wicket with the scoreboard reading 12 when Bangladesh captain Habibul Bashar ran out Majid Haq (5) with a direct throw from square-leg.

Navdeep Poonia (28) and Fraser Watts (32) added 46 runs for the second wicket before paceman Tapash Baisya struck for the Tigers. It was then Abdur Razzak's turn to take charge with his left-arm spin as the Scots crashed to 89-5 losing Watts, Ryan Watson (5) and Gavin Hamilton (9) in the space of 14

1 shot dead by muggers in city

Coal production resumes on test after 6 months

The official pointed out that the mining equipment resumed test operation at 9:00 pm Wednesday but operators shut those down early Thursday morning due to some technical problems which needed to be repaired and tuned. The test run was set to resume again last (Thursday) night.

"For the next one week, we are expecting production of 1,200-1,500 tonnes per day. When we go for full operation, this will go up to 2,000 tonnes. We have coal also in our stock. So, we hope the power plant will not face any coal shortage," the official said.

Chinese company CMC designed and developed this flawed

mine project under a controversial Supplier's Credit with China. It suspended production at the mine in October last year demanding payment of arrears, which include payment for mining equipment without any contract and its annual fee for running operations. CMC also complained that repayment of instalments for the Supplier's Credit was being delayed by a year.

After this, Barapukuria Coal Mining Company Ltd (BCMCL) of Petrobangla paid some arrears but CMC remained adamant not to resume mine operation before it is given the sixth instalment of \$15

13 killed as bus hits microbus in Comilla

(BEPZA), hailed from Feni, microbus driver Bashir Mia, 45, of Senbagh in Noakhali and Abu Hanif, 38, a resident of Kafrul in Dhaka.

Identity of the remaining ten could not be known.

"All the 13 deceased were passengers of the microbus while the injured were bus passengers," said a witness to the tragic accident.

Police with the help of local people recovered the bodies and sent them to the hospital for autopsy.

The driver and the helper of the bus fled the scene immediately after the accident, leaving behind their vehicle. Police seized the bus.

A heavy traffic jam was created on the busy highway for an hour following the accident.
